

Winter Weather Prep with CBEC

When winter settles across the Blue Ridge and Appalachian foothills, the beauty of snow-covered peaks also brings the annual threat of ice, heavy snow and high winds. For CBEC, preparing for winter storms is a year-round priority and we want our members to feel equally confident, informed and ready.

As a local, member-owned cooperative, we know that winter weather can arrive quickly and hit our rural communities especially hard. That's why CBEC maintains a robust storm-response plan that combines preparation, prevention and communication to keep you safe and restore power as efficiently as possible.

HOW CBEC PREPARES LONG BEFORE WINTER ARRIVES

While many members begin winterizing homes in late fall, CBEC's preparation starts months in advance:

Year-Round Vegetation Management

Ice-laden branches are one of the biggest threats to power lines. Our crews and contracted right-of-way clearing company, Hurst Landworks, work throughout the year trimming trees, removing dangerous limbs and clearing rights-of-way to reduce outage risks when winter storms hit.

System Inspections & Equipment Upgrades

CBEC line technicians perform routine inspections on poles, transformers and critical infrastructure. Aging equipment is replaced before peak winter conditions can test the grid's strength.

Emergency Response Training

Every CBEC employee plays a role during storm events — from dispatchers and member service teams to lineworkers. Regular training ensures everyone is prepared to respond swiftly and safely.

Partnerships with Neighboring Co-ops

Through mutual aid agreements, CBEC can call in extra line crews from nearby cooperatives during major outages. This cooperative spirit helps restore service faster and keeps our rural communities resilient.



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A STORM IS ON THE WAY

As soon as winter weather advisories are issued, CBEC's operations center activates storm-monitoring protocols. This includes:

- Staffing additional crews and support teams
- Staging trucks and equipment where they're needed most
- Monitoring weather radar and system performance
- Coordinating with emergency services and local officials

These proactive steps mean we can begin responding the moment conditions allow.

HOW CBEC RESTORES POWER DURING A STORM

When outages occur, CBEC follows a structured restoration process designed to restore power to the greatest number of members as quickly and safely as possible.

- Transmission lines and substations — the backbone of the system
- Main distribution lines — serving large areas of the community
- Tap lines — neighborhood-level lines
- Individual service lines — outages at single homes or properties

Our lineworkers often work around the clock, sometimes in freezing rain, snow and darkness, to ensure power is restored safely.

HOW MEMBERS CAN PREPARE FOR WINTER STORMS

Though CBEC works hard to strengthen the system, preparation at home is just as important. Before winter storms arrive, members should:

Build a Home Emergency Kit

Include flashlights, batteries, blankets, a first-aid kit, nonperishable food, water, prescriptions and a battery-powered radio.

Plan for Backup Heat & Power

If you use a generator, always operate it outdoors, away from windows and vents. Never use ovens or grills for heating.

Charge Devices Early

Fully charge phones, portable battery packs, medical equipment and essential electronics ahead of predicted storms.

Prepare Your Property

- Insulate pipes
- Check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors


- Have firewood ready if you use a wood stove

Stay Connected with CBEC

Energize Your Future: Apply for CBEC's 2026 Scholarships



Craig-Botetourt Electric Cooperative is now accepting scholarship applications from high school seniors planning to continue their education after graduation. Scholarships are offered through the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives Education Scholarship Foundation, which has awarded more than 1,000 scholarships totaling over \$1 million since its creation in 2001.

For the 2026 cycle, applications will be accepted from Feb. 2 through April 1, 2026, and award recipients will be notified no later than June 1, 2026. The online application and complete eligibility details are available at vmdaec.com/scholarship.

High school and homeschooled seniors graduating in spring 2026, whose primary residence is served by CBEC, are invited to apply. Scholarships are \$1,500, with some students receiving awards of up to \$2,500, which may be used at any two- or four-year college or accredited trade/technical school.

Supporting students in their pursuit of higher education reflects CBEC's ongoing commitment to strengthening our community. "Every little bit helps when you're paying for a college education," says VMDAEC Education Scholarship Foundation Chairman Rusty Brown.

Applicants must be entering their first semester of post-secondary, technical or trade school in fall 2026. Scholarship funds, sent directly to the educational institution, may be applied toward tuition, student fees, room and board, and textbooks.

Recipients will be selected by the Foundation's board of directors using the following weighted criteria: financial need (40%), academic achievement (40%) and the applicant's personal statement (20%).
