 - Our charter school was honored as agent of change.
 - CGLA was ranked 2nd high school in Hamilton County.
 - CGLA was also ranked the 18th high school in TN.
 - Academics

- CGLA Transition week included the college tour set to expose the girls to possibilities.
- o I-Ready assessments took place the 9th-18th.
- Teachers completed growth plans to set how they would like to grow this year.
- After school tutoring has started
- The stem redesignation application has been submitted
- o 50% of 6th graders came in strong but we still have a lot of work to do.

Teacher's corner

- We have teachers are getting married and having babies that we are excited to celebrate.
- o Both schools have had new hires
- 95% of seniors are committed to going to college. Dr. Swafford is conducting senior interviews.

Legislative updates

- Senator passed a law if a teacher is out on maternity leave you pay for 6
 weeks and the state will reimburse. Public charter schools are not
 included in this law. Dr. Swafford and others will be working on a letter
 to send to legislatures to have public charter schools included.
- o TVAAS 5 levels will not reflect school's letter grade
- Edna attended the meeting and she shared her concerns regarding the change in letter grade for schools to the committee at the meeting.
