Enrollment

- 313 students are currently enrolled.
- o Priority enrollment application is open until December 15.
- Recruitment billboards are up in our neighborhoods.
- We also have 7 MEHP and 7 CGLA signs inside of CARTA buses.

HR/Ops

- Open enrollment November 15-December 15
- Intent to return letters will go out December 1
- We are now able to prioritize enrollment again according to the law change.
- Hal N. asked about the school's enrollment capacity which is 480. The current goal is 361 students.

Development

- Giving Tuesday campaign is underway. We are utilizing banners and signs outside the school.
- o Our comprehensive Impact Report has successfully been mailed out.
- o MEHP secured a \$50,000 grant recently supporting our Pre-K program.
- Odyssey will take place March 19
- The board development committee met for the first time this month.
- We will be creating a subcommittee to craft a strategic plan.

Finance

- o Enrollment is down, which will impact TISA funds.
- We will be moving away from EdTech due to audit findings.
- We are comfortable transitioning mid-year to the new company that we are moving to.
