

SETTING THE STAGE *for Spring*

PREPARATION STARTS NOW

Refresh & Prepare

- Remove winter debris and fallen leaves
- Cut back dormant perennials and ornamental grasses
- Refresh mulch to protect soil and retain moisture

Prune With A Purpose

- Trim roses, crepe myrtles, and shrubs before new growth begins
- Remove damaged or dead branches from winter weather
- Avoid heavy pruning on spring-flowering plants

Check Irrigation Early

- Inspect sprinkler heads for leaks or misalignment
- Adjust watering schedules as temperatures fluctuate
- Make sure the system is ready before spring's higher water demand

Plan Before You Plant

- Test soil and prep beds for spring flowers
- Finalize landscape designs and planting plans
- February is ideal for planning, not rushing

Early preparation helps landscapes thrive once spring arrives, creating healthier outdoor spaces and stronger curb appeal.
