A closed session occurred during the meeting. Following the equity initiatives agenda item and before new business, a motion to enter a closed session was made by August Chiasera, pursuant to Section 3-305(b)(1)(I) and 3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act, to discuss the resignation of a BDC employee. The session was deemed necessary to protect confidential personnel information, which could potentially discourage future applicants for BDC positions. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously by the directors, with no directors opposing or abstaining, Kim Clark remained in her role as Corporate Secretary, Brennan Murray remained for technical support, and Bill Carlson remained as Corporate Counsel.

August closed the open meeting at 8:06 AM and transitioned to the closed session at 8:__ AM. The closed session ended at 8:23 AM, at which point the open meeting was reconvened. No action was taken following the closed session.

III. President's Report – Colin Tarbert

- BDC attended IEDC's 2025 Leadership Conference in D.C., joining economic development leaders nationwide to explore trends, challenges, and opportunities.
- In Baltimore Magazine's February issue, BDC CEO Colin Tarbert described the city's economic growth as a steady, long-term process. He highlighted revitalization in areas like Remington and East Baltimore and emphasized the role of initiatives like the Neighborhood Impact Investment Fund in supporting underserved communities.
- A year after the Francis Scott Key Bridge collapse, Baltimore reflects on the tragedy and its lasting impact. BDC responded quickly, partnering with city, state, and federal agencies to support affected businesses with vital resources.
- BDC congratulates T. Rowe Price on the opening of its new global headquarters at Harbor Point, a 550,000-square-foot campus that marks a major milestone for the company and the city.
- BDC and ETC proudly supported the launch of Morgan Stanley's Inclusive Ventures Lab Regional Pitch Competitions in Baltimore, showcasing eight innovative startups led by underrepresented founders.
- Baltimore remains a hub for innovation, with local businesses like Taharka Brothers, Sandtown Millworks, Pompeian, and Early Charm Ventures receiving Maryland Manufacturing 4.0 grants to modernize their operations.
- Colin gives thanks to the board for their support, trust, and partnership during his time as President & CEO.

IV. Downtown Data Update – Gabriel Linder

- CFG Bank Arena:
 - \circ 26% increase in visitation from last year at this time within 1,000 ft radius
 - o 17.32% decrease in visitation from Q4 2024 within 1,000 ft radius
- Lexington Market:
 - o 0.85% decrease in visitation from last year at this time within 1,000 ft radius
 - o 2.7% decrease in visitation from Q4 2024 within 1,000 ft radius
- Vacancy Trends:
 - Retail vacancies reduced 0.3% from last quarter (8.4%)
 - Multi-family vacancies reduced 1.1% from last quarter (9.87%)
 - Leases in CBD:
 - o 14 leases signed in Q1 2024 majority lease renewals
