

Born in Minnesota, Ross Lee Finney (1906–1977) always allowed his Midwestern roots to show through his works, bringing a sense of the rustic American prairie to his abstract international style. With his lifetime spanning nearly the entirety of the previous century, Finney's compositions provide a glimpse into the world of 20th – century American concert music. This BMOP recording features Three Pieces, scored for percussion, celesta, strings, and tape recorder (1962), Landscapes Remembered (1971), and Symphony No. 4 (1973) — highlighting a period of Finney's output from the 1960s to the early 1970s, a period that found him embracing the contemporary trends of the day, including serialism and electronics. Listeners can hear references to American folk traditions, explorations of 12–tone technique, and the Proustian focus on memory.
