

# WOL Teen Camp Regulations

1. Everyone is expected to strive to imitate the character of Jesus Christ at camp.
2. Campers must show respect to leaders, volunteers, fellow campers, church property, and the campground at all times.
3. No one shall engage in bullying, gossip, or disrespectful behavior.
4. All campers shall subject their luggage to inspection by the WOL Teen Ministry.
5. Campers shall not bring or use phones or electronic devices. Campers may contact parents/guardians through camp staff or volunteer phones.
6. Everyone staying at camp must be registered.
7. No camper may leave camp with anyone other than a parent or guardian without parental/guardian permission.
  - Campers must let the directors and their counselor know if they leave.
  - All campers must sign out before they leave.
8. All medication must be turned in to the camp nurse upon arrival.
9. All campers, staff, & volunteers shall dress modestly
  - Shorts & skirts must not be shorter than the top of the knee.
  - No sleeveless shirts, open-sided shirts, spaghetti straps, tank tops, bare midriffs, or see-through tops.
  - No skin-tight clothing such as yoga pants or leggings.
    - One must wear a long shirt if such pants are worn.
  - No clothing with offensive or obscene messages.
10. Campers are responsible for keeping their cabins and common areas clean. Trash must be disposed of properly. Personal belongings should be kept organized.
11. Boys and girls must remain in their assigned cabins. No camper is permitted in a cabin of the opposite gender at any time.
12. Lights-out times shall be respected for the benefit of all.

13. No food or drink is allowed in the cabins.
  - For the exception of pure water
14. No camper or non-kitchen staff is allowed in the kitchen area at any time.
  - Per the grounds owner regulations
15. Campers must remain within the designated camp boundaries at all times.
16. All campers, staff, & volunteers are to attend all scheduled events unless excused by the camp nurse or directors.
17. Camp staff is not responsible for personal items lost, stolen, or damaged. Campers should avoid bringing valuables and label all belongings clearly.
18. Romantic behavior, including hand-holding, hugging, or any physical contact interpreted as romantic, is strictly prohibited.
19. Use or possession of illegal substances, alcohol, tobacco, vaping devices, or weapons will result in immediate dismissal from camp, at the parent's expense, with no refund.
20. Lighters, matches, knives, fireworks, or any other dangerous items are strictly prohibited. These will be confiscated and may result in disciplinary action or dismissal.
21. Major or repeated misbehavior (defiance, violence, profanity, vandalism, or inappropriate conduct) will result in the camper being sent home early at the parent's expense. No refunds will be issued.
