IT'S THE LAW

By law, every student must attend at least 90% of the days classes are offered. This includes all types of absences.

→ Compulsory Attendance

All children of school age are required to attend school. This includes pre-K and kindergarten. Virtually and Face-to-Face.

→ Minimum Attendance for Credit

Students must have 90% attendance in each class to receive credit or promotion to the next grade level.

→ Truancy Prevention Measures

Letters must be sent to notify parents when students have 3, 7, and 10 unexcused absences. At 10 unexcused absences, you could be eligible for court.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

FYI

Only 3 parent contacts per semester will be accepted as excused absences (unless otherwise instructed by court officials). For all other absences, students must turn in doctor's notes or other proof.

- Chronic absences in elementary are early warning signs of failing courses in middle and high school.
- → Chronic absences in early grades are linked to higher suspension and drop-out rates.
- → Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.
- → In Texas, a student is considered truant when they have accrued 10 or more absences from school within a six month period during the same school year.
- Missing even ONE CLASS can count towards a student's unexcused absences

- → The following absences reasons count against attendance for credit/court: Runaway, Truant, Out of Town, Absent without parent contact
- → If a student is absent for 3 or more days (or parts of days) in a 4 week period, they may receive truancy prevention measures like; warning, improvement plan, or attendance contract.
- → 3 tardies are added to make an absence (part of a day)
- → Unexcused early pick up are considered an absence (part of a day)
- # 1 Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Attendance improves when schools engage students and parents in positive ways and when schools provide mentors for chronically absent students.
- Absenteeism starts early. One in 10 kindergarten and first grade students are chronically absent. Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade or are held back.

- # 4 By sixth grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- # 5 Research shows that missing 10 percent of school, or about 18 days in most school districts (only 2 days per month), negatively affects a student's academic performance.
- # 6 The academic impact of missing that much school is the same whether absences are excused or unexcused. Suspensions also add to lost time in the classroom.
- # 7 When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.
