- o Discussion ensued about square footage, setbacks, and HOA approvals.
- o Neighbor expressed opposition; Neil Bonds requested accurate drawings.
- o Applicant agreed to table the request.

- o **Vote:** Unanimous approval (5-0)

2. Oak Hill Sports Club Contract

- o Erin Anderson spoke on the need for field use and contract terms.
- o Commissioner Werning requested a schedule by August 18.
- Mayor Taylor raised concern about food trucks; Ms. Anderson stated she had prior approval.
- o Attorney Kelly will draft a revised contract for the next meeting.

3. ISBA Agreement for Municipal Services

- o Public input from Mike Arman (FDOT traffic counts, FPL lighting responsibility) and Bull Lathrom (ditch maintenance questions).
- o Motion to Approve: Commissioner Werning
- o Second: Commissioner Hyatt
- o **Vote:** Unanimous approval (5-0)
