


WORDS OF INSPIRATION





This program is a collaboration with Parenting for Lifelong Health (PLH) and Ateneo de Manila University. It empowers parents and family members to strengthen positive relationships with their children through evidence-based, collaborative, and creative approaches. The program was attended by 60 pairs of parents and teens and facilitated by staff and community facilitators.
- Completion of Emergency and Disaster Preparedness Training-Workshop with FEPAG. Around 90 beneficiaries, composed of HOA officers, health workers, and volunteers from 5 Pasinaya communities in Naic, completed a 5-day training workshop on family emergency plan and hazard mapping, fire and earthquake readiness and prevention, first aid, cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and basic life support (BLS).
- Completion of Baseline in nine socialized housing communities.
- Completion of 3 batches of Immersion.
- Renewed partnership between JNF and PCPC for the BRIGHT Scholarship Program, ensuring continued support for scholars.
- Established a new women empowerment partnership with local government units in Bulacan and Cavite, fostering capacity-building and economic participation opportunities.
- SDM renewed its partnership with the Christian Life Community of the Philippines (CLCP) and Mother of Life (MOL), reinforcing shared commitments to spiritual development in the communities


DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

- Implementation of Masayang Pamilya Program in Phase 1 and 4 Pasinaya Homes Bulacan for 122 families. In addition, a clinical study was conducted to see the impact of the program implementation on the community.
- Emergency Response Training was conducted together with the Fire Emergency Paramedic Assistance Group (FEPAG) in five communities. A total of 90 community members attended the training.
- Panunuluyan - An Immersion program with Xavier School students was conducted in three batches in Pasinaya Homes Phase 1 and 2. 254 students were immersed in the community and 137 community members became foster parents of these students. This has paved the way for students and parents to build lasting connections and has contributed impact on their lives.

JNF continues to uphold its mandate by fostering strong, self-sustaining communities in Bulacan, Cavite, Rizal, and Pampanga. Through the establishment of Homeowners Associations, Clustered Community Cooperatives, and providing support in the Community Foundations, JNF empowers residents with the tools and support needed to build a thriving and sustainable community.





OUR OUTCOMES FOR SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) continues to uphold its commitment to purposeful social development by focusing on meaningful, results-driven initiatives. Rather than merely implementing activities, JNF prioritizes impactful outcomes that align with its mission of building resilient, empowered communities.

Through strategic programs and collaborative efforts, JNF ensures that every project contributes to matatag, maginhawa, and panatag future for Filipinos. By fostering sustainable change, we move beyond short-term interventions—creating lasting transformations that uplift individuals, families, and communities.



OUTCOME 1

Target households are empowered to live in homeful and sustainable social housing communities

Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) has successfully transformed its Home Empowerment Learning Program (HELP) into a fully digital platform through its partnership with Nephila Web Technology Inc. and the integration of the Moodle Learning Management System (LMS). This shift enhances content delivery, user engagement, and accessibility.

Moodle training sessions in March 2024 equipped JNF staff with skills in teaching strategies, content creation, and site administration. By mid-April, JNF launched [hopeful.ph](#), offering guided registration, real-time progress tracking, and mobile accessibility via the Moodle App. Since then, HELP has reached 583 beneficiaries via live Zoom sessions and 6,959 unique users through its asynchronous modules.

To further enhance flexibility, JNF is preparing to transition to a fully asynchronous model, enabling learners

to complete courses at their own pace while engaging with structured, interactive content.

Beyond digital learning, JNF reinforces community-building through in-person initiatives like the Grand HELP Day in Pampanga in September 2024. This event featured workshops and discussions with key partners like Pag-IBIG Fund, equipping participants with knowledge on housing investment and financial literacy. HELP seminars also provide Pag-IBIG loan application guidance, ensuring families are prepared for responsible homeownership.

Through digital innovation and community-driven learning, JNF empowers families to make informed housing decisions and sustain their homes. As HELP continues to evolve, JNF remains committed to providing accessible, high-quality education, reinforcing its mission to build homeful and sustainable communities across the Philippines.



OUTCOME 2

Target households are strongly rooted (Matatag)

Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) remains committed to empowering families and communities by fostering resilience, strong relationships, and social cohesion. As part of Outcome 2, JNF has implemented transformative initiatives that strengthen family dynamics and youth development, ensuring households remain strongly rooted (matatag).

The Masayang Pamilya (MaPa) Program, a collaboration with Ateneo de Manila University's (ADMU) MaPa Organization, was implemented from September 2023 to September 2024 in Pasinaya Homes Phase 1 and 4, Sta. Maria, Bulacan. Designed to improve family relationships and reduce violence against children, the program engaged 122 participants (61 parents and 61 teens) in nine structured sessions, led by 18 trained community facilitators.

Building on this success, JNF launched the MaPa Teens Program on April 13, 2024, in partnership with ADMU and Parenting for Lifelong Health Philippines. The first batch, held from April to June, helped parents understand adolescent behavior while encouraging teens to

express themselves. The second batch, from October to November, engaged 60 families, culminating in a Graduation Day on November 30, 2024.

To further promote togetherness, JNF organized Family Day events in December 2024, themed "Masayang Pamilya, Masayang Pasinaya." The event was held in Naic, Cavite on December 1, and Sta. Maria, Bulacan on December 8. The celebrations featured games, talent showcases, and interactive activities to strengthen family bonds.

Through these initiatives, JNF has reached two communities in Bulacan and continues to build matatag (strongly rooted) families by fostering open communication, mutual understanding, and lasting community connections.





OUTCOME 3

Target households are free from poverty (Maginhawa)

In 2024, Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) made significant progress in cooperative formation in Cavite and Bulacan to build maginhawa (comfortable) communities. JNF is establishing **three cooperative clusters across 17 RLI communities in Naic, Cavite, and two in Bulacan**, fostering economic empowerment and sustainable livelihoods. This initiative engages homeowners and small business owners as cooperators, promoting leadership, accountability, and long-term sustainability while supporting livelihood programs that strengthen local economies and improve household well-being.

The initiative began with courtesy visits to Homeowners' Associations (HOAs) to introduce the program, followed by an orientation with a cooperative consultant on September 8, 2024. From September 9 to 14, JNF conducted economic surveys to assess cooperative viability. To meet registration requirements, a **Pre-Registration Seminar (PRS)** was held on October 12, equipping 36 cooperators with foundational knowledge on cooperative structures. Store-to-store visits further encouraged membership expansion, strengthening community participation.

A key milestone was the **Cooperative Strategic Planning and Assembly** on November 30, 2024, for two cooperative clusters in Sta. Maria, Bulacan. During this assembly, members elected officers, finalized cooperative names, and developed sustainability strategies. To ensure compliance, JNF facilitated the cooperatives' registration through the **CDA's E-CoopRIS platform** and assisted in securing

operational requirements, including surety bonds and cooperative signage.

Moving forward, JNF remains committed to supporting the cooperatives beyond their establishment. Efforts will focus on ensuring regulatory compliance, providing financial and business development training, connecting cooperatives with funding opportunities, and strengthening collaborations with HOAs, local government units (LGUs), and national agencies. Through its commitment to economic independence and self-sufficiency, JNF strengthens communities by empowering households to secure lasting financial stability and sustainable growth.





OUTCOME 4

Target households are governed effectively, efficiently, and sustainably (Panatag)

Fostering leadership and governance among community members is central to achieving the panatag (secure) outcome—ensuring stability and structured governance in communities. A key highlight was the **Leadership Training, Parliamentary Procedures, and Records Management Seminar** held on April 19, 2024, in partnership with **One Naic PS and Federation President Marilyn Ramos**. The seminar brought together 67 HOA Officers and Board Members from Pasinaya, Pagsinag, and Pagsibol, culminating in a **Grand Oath-Taking Ceremony** led by Mayor Raffy Dualan, representing the LGU, and reinforcing the commitment of newly trained leaders to sustainable community development.

Emergency resilience remains a cornerstone of JNF's governance initiatives. Between February and April, JNF partnered with **FEPAG-EMS to facilitate emergency preparedness workshops for 90 participants in Naic, Cavite**, covering family emergency planning, hazard mapping, fire and earthquake preparedness, and first aid training. As a result, community members committed to forming emergency response teams, with plans for further capacity-building and accreditation by the **Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO)**.

JNF also prioritized women's empowerment and youth leadership through initiatives of the **Women Empowerment Center (WEC)** under its Nation-Building Institute. The **ZUMBABAIHAN: Lakas ng Kababaihan, Kilalanin!** event engaged 170 women in leadership and wellness activities, while

gender sensitivity and youth leadership programs trained 184 students and youth leaders in Cavite and Bulacan.

JNF further reinforced governance structures by supporting the institutionalization of **Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and Community Foundations**. In Cavite and Bulacan, multiple CSOs have advanced their registration processes, representing key sectors such as socio-cultural development, environmental sustainability, peace and order, emergency preparedness, and women's and youth empowerment.

JNF concluded the year with the **Participatory Community Assessment (PCA) and Training Needs Assessment (TNA) Workshop** on December 15, bringing together 91 HOA and CSO leaders. The session identified community challenges, formalized commitments to structured governance, and laid the groundwork for sustainable, empowered communities. The insights gathered will guide JNF's future programs, ensuring that governance structures continue to evolve in response to community needs. These initiatives have collectively reached 26 RLI communities in Cavite and Bulacan, fostering greater community engagement and sustainable development.



OUTCOME 5

The homefulness model is replicated by other social housing communities

In 2024, Joy~Nostalg Foundation's **Homefulness Model** advanced from an individual-centered approach to a structured, knowledge-driven framework designed for replication across social housing communities. This model integrates sustainable housing, governance, and community resilience, creating a scalable solution for socialized housing nationwide.

A key driver of this initiative is the **Knowledge Innovations Institute**, which facilitates capacity building through structured training programs on HOA governance, financial literacy, emergency preparedness, and sustainable community practices. It also spearheads research and content development, conducting impact studies and knowledge-sharing initiatives to refine and scale the Homefulness Model. Furthermore, the institute convenes the **Homefulness Summit**, an annual platform that brings together stakeholders to exchange insights, discuss best practices, and explore innovations in housing and community development.

Looking ahead, Outcome 5 aims to drive long-term systemic change by expanding the Homefulness Model to more communities through structured training and partnerships. Digital accessibility will be enhanced through hopeful.ph, allowing communities to access financial literacy and governance resources remotely. Cross-sector collaboration with government agencies, private developers, NGOs, and grassroots organizations will also be strengthened to ensure adaptability and sustainability.

By anchoring this initiative in research, innovation, and structured learning, JNF ensures that social housing communities move beyond short-term interventions toward long-term stability and self-sufficiency. The Homefulness Model continues to evolve as a nationally replicable framework, empowering social housing communities to build resilient and sustainable futures.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT INITIATIVES



In 2024, Joy Nostalg Foundation (JNF) strengthened its community engagement strategies by integrating structured spiritual development initiatives, conducting community baselining, and expanding immersive experiences that foster social responsibility and nation-building.

INTEGRATION OF SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT INTO THE RESULTS FRAMEWORK



Recognizing the vital role of faith and values formation in holistic development, JNF has formally integrated spiritual development and Pananahan interventions into its Results Framework. This ensures that community engagement is not only skill-and-resource-based but also anchored in character formation, resilience, and well-being.

Beginning in 2024, JNF's spiritual development initiatives, including the **Pananahan Programs**, will be strategically integrated into the Results Framework to provide a holistic and sustainable approach to community empowerment.

The Panahan Programs of Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) are designed to foster spiritual growth, strengthen community values, and promote faith-based reflections among individuals and families in partner communities. These initiatives provide opportunities for personal renewal, deepening faith, and building stronger connections within communities. Activities under the Panahan interventions are:

“ANG KUYA” RECOLLECTION



A spiritual formation program that empowers young men, community leaders, and families by nurturing purpose, responsibility, and faith-driven leadership. Inspired by Fr. Johnny Go, SJ's storybook *Ang Kuya*, it cultivates authentic accompaniment, active listening, and meaningful presence to strengthen relationships and deepen spiritual life.

A total of 119 attendees for *Ang Kuya* Recollection in Pasinaya Homes, Phase 1 Chapel, Sta. Maria, Bulacan:

- Batch 1 was attended by 28 youths on August 10, 2024
- Batch 2 by 91 community members on September 14, 2024

A total of 204 community members attended the *Ang Kuya* Recollection in Santa Candida Maria de Jesus Parish, Naic, Cavite:

- Batch 1 was attended by 66 community members on August 25, 2024
- Batch 2 was attended by 138 community members on September 29, 2024

BASELINING AND COMMUNITY PROFILING



As part of its commitment to **evidence-based decision-making and sustainable community development**, Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) conducted a comprehensive baselining census

across nine communities. This initiative aimed to gather essential data on demographics, skills, and socio-economic conditions, ensuring that JNF's programs remain community-centered and responsive to the actual needs of the people it serves.

A total of **15,055 households** were surveyed through various data collection methods. The census and survey process was conducted using an offline-capable survey tool, which proved essential for areas with weak network signals, particularly in Naic, Cavite. This allowed the team to efficiently collect accurate and real-time data without disruptions. In addition to surveys, Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) were held to gain deeper insights into community dynamics, enabling participants to voice their concerns, experiences, and aspirations. Furthermore, Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) were conducted with local leaders, stakeholders, and residents to understand the broader socio-economic landscape and identify potential areas for intervention.

The data gathered from this initiative will be instrumental in shaping JNF's Community Partnership Strategy, ensuring that future programs are strategically designed to promote self-sufficiency and resilience.

IMMERSION - PANUNULUYAN PROGRAM



Beyond faith-based programs, Joy~Nostalg Foundation (JNF) champions immersion activities to foster empathy, solidarity, and active citizenship. Through community immersions, exposure trips, and direct engagement with grassroots communities, participants develop a deeper understanding of social realities and are encouraged to take meaningful actions toward sustainable development.

In 2024, JNF, through the Community Immersion Center, successfully conducted the **Panunuluyan immersion program in partnership with Xavier School**. This three-day immersion program served **254 students and 30 teachers** across three batches, engaging **137 foster families** from Pasinaya Homes Phases 1 and 2 in Sta. Maria, Bulacan.

The program made a significant impact on both students and host families:

- 85.1% of foster families reported the highest satisfaction with student interactions, highlighting strong engagement.
- 93.4% of participants gave the highest rating for program clarity, demonstrating effective structure and communication.

- 100% of participating foster families expressed willingness to host future immersion activities, ensuring sustainability.
- Community participation was further strengthened through activities such as clean-up drives and religious celebrations, reinforcing collective responsibility and shared values.

By immersing students in real-life community settings, JNF enables them to develop critical perspectives on social issues, cultivate leadership, and inspire meaningful contributions to nation-building. The Panunuluyan program stands as a model for impactful, community-centered immersion initiatives, building connections that extend far beyond the duration of the program.

Sa mga programa ng JNF ngayon ang pinaka-memorable po, I think MaPa (Masayang Pamilya). Kasi sa MaPa, sabi ko nga, kasi siyempre ako. nanay 'di ba? Iba iyong discipline ko sa anak ko. Iba rin iyong pansarili kong disiplina so walang nag-a-advise sa akin na ganito pala. So mayroon din kaming seminars katulad sa anak ko, SPED. nag-a-attend ako ng seminar sa mga doktor para malaman kung paano ko siya i-assist. So iyong sa MaPa, na-excite ako kasi nag-seminar kami d'yan. Ayon, nakakapagod tapos ang kagandahan doon natututo akong makipag-kapwa tao, hindi ako nahihiya.

Bukod sa nakikisalamuha ako sa trabaho ko, iba pa rin iyong mayroon kang kakausapin na iba iyong lebel sa ginagawa mo, sa trabaho mo, ganoon. So may na-le-learn ako doon na mayroon palang paraan ng pagdi-disiplina lalo na sa family. So hindi mo kailangan daanin sa puro sigaw kasi parent ka. So kailangan mong pasukin iyong mundo nila para maging maayos iyong pagpapalaki.

In JNF's programs, I think the most memorable one is MaPa (Masayang Pamilya). Because with MaPa—like I said—of course, I'm a mother, right?

My way of disciplining my child is different, and I also have my own personal discipline, so no one was really advising me on what the right approach should be. I also attend seminars for my child, who is in SPED, where I learn from doctors how to assist them. So when MaPa came along, I got excited because we had a seminar there. It was tiring, but the great thing about it was that I learned how to connect with other people without feeling shy.

Aside from interacting with others through my work, it's still different when you get to talk to people who have different experiences from yours. I learned that there are better ways to discipline, especially within the family. You don't have to resort to shouting just because you're the parent. You need to enter and understand their world to raise them properly.

Before, my child was very shy and would always keep problems to himself. Whenever he didn't want to talk, he would just stay in a corner. But when we attended MaPa Teens, I was surprised—my child started opening up to me and was no longer hesitant to say, "Ma, this is my problem," or "Ma, these are the things I want to do in life."

Thank you so much for your program; it has been such a big help to us as a homemaker and a teenager. We've come to understand that we should always communicate with our children. Now, my child opens up to us regularly, and we do the same about how we feel. It's actually scary to think about what happens when you don't talk to your child. Parents and teenagers truly need to be open with each other.

Thank you for all your help—you have made a significant difference in improving our relationship as a parent and child. Your program is wonderful.






