PRACTICING DEVOTION

Setting Replication Expectations For Our Group

Who are you hoping or praying might join our group?

What are your hopes for them if they do?

When is a good time to invite new members to our group?

Who in our group is open to or currently being coached to lead their own group one day?

How will we decide it's time for our group to grow?

Jesus warns His followers to count the cost of following Him. As we define obedience to our part in making disciples, what are the costs to us individually and as a group if we are devoted to growth and replication?

How can we as a group discern and determine the details of replicating our group? What will the practice of seeking the Lord's timing look like?

What replication strategy do you imagine for your group in the future?
