QUARTER 2 HIGHLIGHTS





We participated in San Diego's "Hands Off" Earth Day event, in partnership with SanDiego350, to protest the Trump Administration's attempts to strip climate nonprofits of their 501(c)(3) status as well as erode climate policies and programs. We also stood up for climate justice at the Make Polluters Pay press event and the "No Kings" march.

We hosted our second annual pickleball fundraiser, benefiting the Olivewood Gardens & Learning Center in National City, which successfully raised \$13,120 to support their clean energy project, bringing the total funding secured for this new roof, solar, storage and heat pump project to the total project cost of \$155,000. The system is installed and producing clean energy! Thanks to all of the project supporters!





Our third cohort of college interns completed their internships. We were happy to host two San Diego State University students, Isabella Louie and Lucas Baker, who served as our Climate Justice Intern and Climate Graphic Designer Intern. Congratulations to both of them for graduating in June!

Our founder and executive director met with the office of Arizona Governor Katie Hobbs to discuss solar programs and policies to make solar more accessible to renters, low income communities and tribal communities. Tara has been invited to speak at the upcoming Arizona Tribal Clean Energy Summit.





Our founder and executive director, Tara Hammond, traveled to La Crosse, Wisconsin to accept the Partner of the Year award from the La Crosse County Library Foundation, visited a dozen Solar Moonshot Program grantee solar sites and met with community leaders.

We were invited to speak at Rep. Mike Levin's 123rd Town Hall in Encinitas. Tara spoke about how the Federal Budget Reconciliation Bill would negatively impact clean energy projects while increasing electric bills for everyone and extending reliance on fossil fuels.



SOLAR MOONSHOT PROGRAM



Our <u>Solar Moonshot Program</u> supports nonprofit organizations in making the transition to clean solar energy by providing critical funding for clean energy projects that might not otherwise be possible.

In addition to direct grants through the program, we also offer short-term, low-interest recoverable grants to help cover project costs offset by the Investment Tax Credit. These recoverable grants not only extend the impact of Solar Moonshot Program funding but also help establish a sustainable revenue stream, enabling the program to support even more organizations in their shift to renewable energy.

Launch Partnership with the SD International Film Festival

Support Solar, Storage and Clean Energy Workshops in National City

Last year, we were awarded a \$100,000 grant from San Diego Community Power, in partnership with the San Diego Foundation and Calpine Energy. This funding helped advance a solar and battery storage project at Olivewood Gardens & Learning Center, along with educational clean energy workshops that focus on youth workforce development. We'll be co-hosting the first workshop for youth who are interested in going into the clean energy space on October 4! More details will be announced on our social media channels soon.



Continue Strong Climate Advocacy

We are actively using our voice and resources to advance climate justice across San Diego, California and throughout the country. Our team continues to champion equitable clean energy policies and programs that deliver tangible benefits to local communities—especially those historically underserved. This includes our strong opposition to the "Big Beautiful Bill," which threatens to erode critical clean energy tax credits and limit access to renewable solutions. We're committed to protecting these incentives and ensuring they remain available to nonprofits, families and frontline communities who need them most.



Managing A Clean Energy Grant Program

We have agreed to manage a \$500,000 clean energy grant program for projects in Oceanside. More details should be announced next month.



Securing Funding for Climate Programs

We are actively pursuing additional funding opportunities to expand our programs, scale our impact and bring clean energy solutions as well as climate education to more communities across the country.
