General Manager's Report

Louise O'Connell

As we celebrate 130 Years of Community Spirit, it is with great pride and deep gratitude that I reflect on the achievements of the Byron Community Centre. This year has been one of consolidation, innovation and renewed community connection, as we continue to deliver vital services, cultural enrichment and inclusive spaces for all who live in and visit the Byron Shire.

Our community support service at **Fletcher Street Cottage** continued to be a lifeline for many. We strengthened partnerships with local health and welfare providers, extended outreach programs, including the launch of the **Women's Space**, and improved service delivery through dedicated case management.

The appointment of an **Operations Manager** - funded through generous donor support - has been a critical development, helping streamline operations and free up leadership capacity to focus on strategic direction and fundraising.

Our cultural and creative programs also thrived. The **Byron Theatre** hosted **185 shows**, including films, festivals and community events. It remains a cornerstone of arts and culture in our region, offering an inclusive and inspiring space for both professional and community-led productions.

The **Byron Markets** - Community, Twilight and Beachside - celebrated one of their strongest years to date. These markets are an important income stream for over **500 local businesses**, reflecting the essence of Byron's creative and community spirit while attracting locals and visitors.

Byron Spaces, our social enterprise providing affordable venue hire, coworking areas and community rooms, continued to expand its reach with over **1,000 space hires**. These spaces have been increasingly used by community groups, supporting connection, enterprise and social inclusion.

Volunteers remain at the heart of everything we do. Over **260 volunteers** contributed across our programs this year - offering skills, time and care that make our work possible.

As we move forward, our priorities remain clear - to build a resilient, inclusive and vibrant Byron Shire through responsive services, creative initiatives and strong community partnerships.

Thank you to our valued staff, volunteers, donors, Board and community supporters - you are the foundation of everything we achieve.

Chair's Report

In 2025, we celebrated a remarkable milestone of *130 Years of Community Spirit* at the Byron Community Centre. It has been a privilege to reflect on this legacy and to see the organisation continue to grow as a place of connection, creativity and compassion for the people of Byron Shire.

Our focus at Board level has been to support the management team in strengthening systems and delivering on the strategic plan. The achievement of **Australian Service Excellence Standards** (ASES) accreditation was a significant milestone, confirming the quality of our governance and operations, and positioning the organisation strongly for future funding opportunities.

The work of the Byron Community Centre across Fletcher Street Cottage, Byron Theatre, Byron Markets and Byron Spaces has continued to make a profound impact. We have launched new programs in 2025, including the **Byron Seniors Club, Women's Space** and **Byron Spaces Gallery**.

We were proud to celebrate Fletcher Street Cottage's **Breakfast Space** recognised as **2024 Community Initiative of the Year** and **Byron Theatre** awarded **2024 Outstanding Evening Economy Experience**. These achievements highlight both the professionalism of our teams and the trust our community places in us.

As Chair, I want to acknowledge the dedication of my fellow Board members, whose contributions of time, expertise and insight are invaluable. Together with our outstanding staff, 260 dedicated volunteers and generous supporters, we are ensuring that the Byron Community Centre remains at the heart of community life.

I would also note that the Board has been strengthened with the addition of **John Hertzberg**, **Kerry O'Brien** and the return of previous long-standing member **Peter Tanner**.

It should also be acknowledged that this was **Louise O'Connell**'s last full year as General Manager. The Byron Community Centre is in an enviable position as a result of Louise's management skills, community involvement and fundraising successes.

This year has shown once again that our organisation is resilient, adaptable and deeply rooted in the spirit of Byron. On behalf of the Board, I extend my deepest thanks to all who have supported our mission. Together, we continue to honour our history while building the foundations for a strong and sustainable future.



Secretary's Report

The past year has been one of achievement, collaboration and resilience for the Byron Community Centre. We held regular monthly Board meetings, maintaining strong governance and oversight across all aspects of the organisation.

A major highlight was achieving **Australian Service Excellence Standards** (ASES) accreditation, confirming our commitment to continuous quality improvement. This accreditation not only validates our systems and processes but also strengthens our eligibility for future funding.

Board activities this year have encompassed **finance**, **governance**, **fundraising**, **HR and risk management**, with each portfolio contributing to the Byron Community Centre's long-term sustainability. We developed the strategic plan and further improved organisational systems to enhance efficiency and effectiveness.

In the past year, we have welcomed three new directors: **Kerry O'Brien**, **John Hertzberg** and myself, **Peter Tanner**. **Lindy Swain** resigned as Secretary, with **David Sweet** stepping into the role temporarily before my appointment. I bring prior experience on the Board, returning after a 2.5 year hiatus. Karen Hillen stepped down as Vice Chair and was replaced by Louisa McKay, while continuing as a Director and providing integral HR support.

The FY25 theme, 130 Years of Community Spirit, has been integrated into our governance approach, reflecting the strength, continuity and adaptability of the organisation. Our Board and management team have worked to strengthen relationships with donors, funding bodies and partners, recognising that these connections are vital to our success.

This year has again demonstrated the resilience of our staff, volunteers and Board in navigating change while keeping our mission at the heart of every decision. Together, we have continued to uphold the Byron Community Centre as a cornerstone of creativity, connection and care in our community.

Treasurer's Report

In FY25, the Byron Community Centre celebrated 130 Years of Community Spirit, a milestone that reminds us of both the history and collective strength of the community, donors and partners who make our work possible.

This year saw the launch of two important programs making a real difference. The **Byron Seniors Club**, launched in January 2025, welcomed 396 seniors to connect and stay active. At Fletcher Street Cottage, the new **Women's Space** was made possible through donations and grants.

Encouragingly, the **NSW Street Count** (February 2025) recorded 291 people sleeping rough in Byron Shire - a **16% decrease** on the previous year. This decline highlights the vital role of Fletcher Street Cottage and its work connecting people with housing and support pathways.

The **Byron Theatre** celebrated its **21st Birthday** in 2024, staging 185 events across music, theatre, cinema and ideas. The **Byron Theatre Company**, launched in 2025, will premiere its first original production, *Displace I Call Home*, thanks to grants from Create NSW and Regional Arts NSW.

The **Byron Markets** supported 500 local businesses and partnered with the Byron Surf Festival in 2024. Meanwhile, **Byron Spaces** reached a record year, hosting over 1,000 events and meetings, and supporting 18 community groups, reinforcing its role as a hub for connection.

Financially, FY25 brought both challenges and opportunities. Total income declined to **\$2,690,065**, a 19% decrease year-on-year, with donations contributing **\$1,270,417**, down 26% from FY24. These results reflect the broader economic climate, a tightening philanthropic environment and the increasing importance of securing multi-year government funding to ensure long-term viability.

In response, we focused more than ever on deliberate allocation of resources, enabling the organisation to continue delivering vital services and prioritising new initiatives where they are the most needed. The **FY25** audit by Butlers Chartered Accountants resulted in a positive, unqualified audit certificate.

As we reflect on this milestone year, we extend our deepest gratitude to our donors, volunteers, partners and the Byron community. Your support allows us to provide essential services, foster culture and creativity, and ensure that we remain a place of connection for all.



In 2025, the Byron Community Centre proudly celebrated 130 years of connection, creativity and care in the heart of Byron Bay. Did you know the building once hosted a library, coffee parlour, skating rink and the town's first silent movie theatre? What began in 1895 as the **Byron Bay School of Arts** has grown into a vibrant hub supporting locals and visitors through essential services, social enterprises and cultural programs.



Honouring Our Legacy

The theme 130 Years of Community Spirit ran throughout our programs, reinforcing the values of connection, inclusivity and resilience. Archival photos and stories were shared, in collaboration with the **Byron Bay Historical Society**, connecting past generations with today's community.

This milestone was not only a chance to celebrate but also a reminder of our responsibility to continue evolving. By honouring our history, we are strengthening our commitment to the future - ensuring we remain a place of support, creativity and belonging for the next generation.

- Information & Referrals 1,500 enquiries were processed by our Reception team and volunteers, linking community members to vital local services and resources quickly and effectively.
- Tax Help Centre Two ATO-accredited volunteers assisted 19 low income earners with their tax returns between July and October 2024, reducing financial stress and building confidence.
- Byron Counselling Free and subsidised counselling supported community members, staff and volunteers through 100 phone, online and in-person sessions to improve mental health.



Community Programs

Fletcher Street Cottage





Overview

In FY25, Fletcher Street Cottage's staff and volunteers worked together to provide a safe, welcoming place for those facing hardship. We supported more than **900 visits each month**, with service users accessing essential aid such as meals, showers, laundry, casework and referrals to co-located services.

We continued to offer successful creative and wellbeing programs, including Breakfast Space and our weekly Art Space, and launched a new **Women's Space** in March 2025 in response to increasing demand.

Partnerships with **24 external providers** ensured wraparound care in areas including health, legal aid, housing and counselling.

Decrease in Rough Sleepers 291 Street Count

Fletcher Street Cottage is an active participant in the Ending Rough Sleeping Collaboration Byron Shire, contributing to the *By Name List* and broader strategic discussions. While the Byron Shire continues to record the highest rates of rough sleepers in regional NSW, real progress is being made. The 2025 Street Count recorded 291 rough sleepers, down from 348 in 2024, resulting in a 16% decrease.

Fletcher Street Cottage is open four days a week from Tuesday to Friday and offers the following services:



Breakfast Space

7am - 9am

Breakfast provides nourishment, connection and a safe entry for people to engage with support services.

Showers & Laundry

7am - 11:30am

Access to hot showers and laundry facilities provides people with a sense of dignity, comfort and restored wellbeing.

Emergency Relief

Financial aid for prescriptions, phones and transport, plus vouchers for food, fuel and clothing. Provision of tents and sleeping bags.



Office Support

8am - 12pm

Information sharing, practical assistance and access to phones, internet, printing and document help, all in a welcoming space.



Personalised Care

9am-12pm

Our Community Support Workers offer personalised care, referrals, service navigation and advocacy.

Breakfast Space

Tuesday to Friday, 7am - 9am

Art Space

9:30-11am Every Thursday 1-3pm Women's Afternoon

Our weekly Art Space is a safe, welcoming program where participants can explore creativity in their own way. With access to art resources and gentle guidance, it offers a soft entry into artistic expression, reducing stress, building confidence and fostering connection.

Women's Space

Launched on International Women's Day (8 March) 2025, Women's Space provides a safe, supportive environment where women can access emergency relief, psychosocial support and connection, developed in response to rising demand for women's services.

Women's Afternoon 1-3pm Weekly

In May 2025, the program expanded with a new **Women's Afternoon**, which provides showers, laundry, meals, emergency relief and one-on-one support with Community Support Workers. Women enjoy creative art activities, afternoon tea and access to laundry and shower facilities. Specialist services for women include housing and tenancy support, legal advice, mental health support, financial aid and domestic violence casework.



"Over the past three years, we have seen an increase in women arriving at Fletcher Street Cottage overwhelmed, isolated and unsure where to go. These women are often fleeing domestic and family violence, facing homelessness and do not have access to basic needs such as food, showers and safe shelter.

A dedicated Women's Afternoon creates a safe, welcoming space where women can be heard, supported and connected to the help they deserve.

Young Mother in Crisis

A young mum was homeless, recovering from surgery and unable to afford rent, food or transport. Her child couldn't attend school and the family had no access to government support. A Community Support Worker provided emotional support, assisted with documents and applied for a \$1k emergency grant. Two weeks later, she returned - healthy, hopeful, her child back in school, their car repaired and new housing in sight.



An Addiction Journey


Over a period of three months, a young man was supported at Fletcher Street Cottage while working to overcome alcohol and drug addiction. Our team connected him with crisis payments, temporary accommodation, legal and housing support, and provided practical assistance such as fuel vouchers to attend essential appointments. These supports have helped him maintain sobriety, access services and take steps toward stability.

Housing Support for All Abilities

A man with a hearing impairment left unsafe housing in Lismore and struggled with unaffordable rent in Byron. With the help of a volunteer Auslan interpreter, we connected him to a specialist homelessness service, completed his intake and secured immediate temporary accommodation. He is now safely housed in supported accommodation, deeply grateful for the collaborative effort that made it possible.



Byron Theatre Company

2025 marked an important new chapter for Byron Theatre, with the launch of our own resident theatre company. This milestone represents our long-term vision to create original works that reflect the stories, voices and spirit of our community while attracting new audiences to the arts.

The company's premiere production, *Displace I Call Home*, will debut in July 2025 as a powerful exploration of identity and belonging. It will bring together a talented ensemble of local and national professional artists, showcasing Byron Theatre as a hub for new Australian writing and performance. This sets the foundation for future works, positioning the Byron Theatre Company as a vital part of the region's creative landscape.

Displace I Call Home attracted substantial grant funding from both the federal and state government, opening up new funding opportunities for the organisation.







A Creative Meeting Place

Beyond our in-house productions, Byron Theatre continued to present a diverse program of film, live performance, touring music and community events. Partnerships with local organisations, visiting artists and cultural festivals strengthened our reputation as a creative meeting place that fosters collaboration and inclusion.



The Byron Speakeasy

We expanded our live music and cabaret programming with the introduction of *The Byron Speakeasy* in **January 2025**. These cabaret concerts will become a highlight of our annual calendar, blending music, theatre and atmosphere to create unforgettable nights that resonate with both locals and visitors.

Byron Spaces Gallery

Launched in June 2025 as part of the 130 Years of Community Spirit celebrations, Byron Spaces Gallery provides a free, accessible exhibition space for local artists. The debut exhibition, Magic Birds of Australia by Byron Markets stallholder Valentina Di Blase (ValeVale Art), was a captivating celebration of native birdlife with hidden glow-in-the-dark messages. The gallery strengthens our role as a cultural hub by supporting emerging and established artists, adding fresh energy to our spaces and showcasing Byron's creative talent.

Community Murals

The program extends to public art, featuring a beautiful new mural by Valentina on the back of the Byron Community Centre. Celebrating local identity, it depicts iconic landmarks such as the Byron lighthouse and "Cheer Up, Slow Down, Chill Out" sign, alongside a surfer, humpback whale and kombi van. Valentina also created a second sponsored mural at **Bayleaf Café**, marking 130 Years of Community Spirit with colour and creativity.

The Byron Markets are a vibrant showcase of the region's creativity and community spirit, bringing together locals, visitors, musicians and makers since 1987. Across the Community, Twilight and Beachside Markets, we delivered **46 markets** in FY25, supporting over **500 local businesses** and paying more than \$30,000 to musicians.

Despite challenges with weather, only three markets were cancelled, and each event remained a place for connection, discovery and celebration. From lively Saturday nights under the stars at the Twilight Market, to bustling town centre Community Markets and the coastal energy of the Beachside Market, Byron Markets remain an authentic reflection of Byron's heart and soul.

Graham Double stepped down as Markets Manager in October 2024, and **Carl Taylor** served as Acting Markets Manager before formally taking on the role in March 2025. Looking ahead, the Community Market will move back to its former beachfront location in July 2025 due to Byron Shire Council's drainage works in the town centre.



Byron Seniors Launched in 2025

Launched in January 2025, the **Byron Seniors Club** has quickly grown into a vibrant and highly successful program. In just six months it has created a welcoming and inclusive community with **396 members** where seniors connect, move, engage, create and celebrate together.

Membership is free, ensuring accessibility for all. The program is designed to reduce social isolation, foster belonging and support wellbeing. From **Elder Beats Drumming** and **Hula Dance** to **Storytelling**, theatre, information nights and social gatherings, the club has delivered a diverse program that reflects the creativity and spirit of Byron Shire's elders, always with a focus on fun, connection and wellbeing.

The response has been extraordinary. Many sessions quickly reached capacity with waitlists forming - a clear sign of the strong demand and value of this program in the community.



Byron Seniors 31

An evaluation survey of **60 participants** revealed outstanding outcomes:

- · 100% felt welcomed and included
- 94% felt more socially connected
- 92% experienced a stronger sense of belonging
- 92% reported improved mood and outlook
- 90% felt higher energy levels
- 84% noticed improvements in physical health or mobility

Participants consistently described the Byron Seniors Club as **joyful, inclusive and uplifting**. For many, it has become a highlight of their week and an anchor of connection.

The Byron Seniors Club is not only enriching individual lives but strengthening the social fabric of our community. It is building relationships, reducing isolation and creating spaces where seniors feel valued, celebrated and connected.





Sustainability Focus

Women's Emergency Relief Fund

Fletcher Street Cottage \$10,000 Grant Funding 160 Women Supported

Thank you to the **Country Women's Association (CWA) Bangalow**, who provided the first seed grant for us to launch a dedicated Women's
Emergency Relief Fund to run alongside our traditional ER program. This fund gave our frontline staff greater flexibility to respond immediately to women and children in extreme crises. Emergency Response & Preparedness

\$11,000 Grant Funding

When Ex-Tropical Cyclone Alfred hit in February 2025, the **Northern Rivers Community Foundation** and **Ingrained Foundation** responded quickly with rapid grants to support immediate needs for rough sleepers at Fletcher Street Cottage. NRCF also funded critical supplies for future emergencies, showing how strong, trust-based partnerships enable us to act fast in times of crisis.
