ACTIONS

To earn the Community Badge, complete **five** of the following actions, or get creative and make up your own!

- Hold a whole school assembly to introduce the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and share the definition and types of bullying behaviour.
- Organise a fundraising event for a local charity or a cause relating to anti-bullying.
- Visit local schools to teach others what bullying behaviour is and how to tackle it.
- Design an anti-bullying project with another school in the local area.
- Host a meeting with governors/school counsellors/Academy Trust members to discuss anti-bullying.
- Invite the local Member of Parliament (MP) for a presentation about your anti-bullying work.
- Reach out to your local news or radio station to share information about your school's anti-bullying mission.
- Design awareness posters to display in local community spaces.
- Run an assembly or parents evening for parents/carers to learn more about bullying behaviour.
- Create literature (brochures, posters, etc.) for parents/carers about how to spot bullying behaviour.
- Invite a speaker from a local charity or cause to talk to the Anti-Bullying Ambassador Team or whole school about bullying behaviour or a related topic.
- Create an accessible, youth-friendly anti-bullying policy and share it with the rest of your school.
- Run your own anti-bullying awareness training for teachers and other school staff.
- Propose an idea or project to your Senior Leadership Team to get them involved in your anti-bullying mission.
- Attend any additional training provided by The Diana Award.
- Share your anti-bullying knowledge with other students by running peer-led training sessions in school.
- Add an anti-bullying page to the school website and update it with blog posts, information, and announcements.
- Create a whole school poster highlighting the different roles members of the school community play to stop bullying behaviour.
