ACTA Oncologica NORDIC PRECISION CANCER MEDICINE SYMPOSIUM 2025



The second ACTA Oncologica Nordic Precision Cancer Medicine Symposium took place in Oslo on 15.-17. September with the topic Merging Clinical Research and Standard Healthcare.


The conference was hosted by Oslo University Hospital and MATRIX, and had around 180 participants from 15 countries.

Over three days the participants enjoyed three keynote lectures, presentations from 15 invited speakers, as well as eight short talks selected from submitted abstracts. 34 posters were also presented.

The scientific organizing committee consisted of Åslaug Helland, Kjetil Taskén, Hege Russnes and Sigbjørn Smeland, and they put together an excellent and inspiring program. The conference was well organized and ran smoothly thanks in no small part to the major effort by Elisa Bjørgo.

SIGRID SKÅNLAND RELEASED THE BOOK "PEOPLE WITH CANCER"



Sigrid Skånland, project leader at Institute for Cancer Research (ICR) at Oslo University Hospital and researcher in MATRIX, was awarded the prize Researcher of the Year back in 2023. The prize was a 100,000 NOK that allowed Sigrid to combine her research background with her artistic side as a photographer.

She has now launched her book "People with cancer" where she presents portraits of 50 cancer patients along with snippets of their life story.

FUNDING FROM THE NORWEGIAN CANCER SOCIETY



Jo-Åsmund Lund, Ålesund Hospital, has been awarded a grant from the Norwegian Cancer Society for his project "Patient Centred Care in Ålesund".

The project aims to develop patientcentered cancer care pathways and measure patient-perceived quality using PROMs (Patient-Reported Outcome Measures) before, during, and after treatment.
