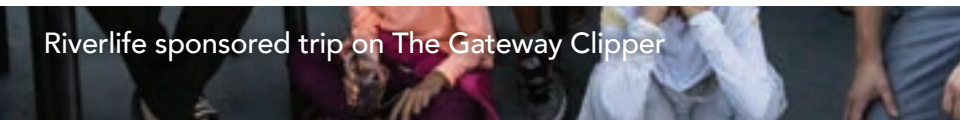

The refugees we serve come from a variety of countries, backgrounds, languages and religions. The one commonality they have is the desire to have a better life than what they were forced to leave behind. Many have been through incredibly challenging situations; they have left most, if not all, of their support system behind and are alone in a new county with new customs and a new language. For these families of all ages, shapes and sizes to know that a local Pittsburgher cares about them and is invested in their success is an incredibly positive feeling and something they appreciate and cherish.
