Refugee-First Mindset: We believe that all of our work should start with the best interests of the refugees that we serve as voiced by them.



Cross-Cultural Sensitivity: We believe in having a thoughtful approach toward the refugee families we support. We know the best answers come from really listening to the needs of the community and that trauma-informed care impacts programmatic support.



Dignified Storytelling: We believe in protecting the privacy and dignity of refugee families by sharing their stories in a respectful way. We strive to be mindful of and sensitive to the journeys and trauma these stories may represent.



Cultivating Community: We believe the most important aspect of our program is the human connection and trust that comes from mentor/mentee relationships. Listening and connecting over shared experiences helps to foster a community that transcends cultures.



Inclusive Support: We believe in welcoming and standing beside all refugees and immigrants—regardless of race, religion, age, national origin, citizenship status or sexual orientation—and honoring their experiences and voices with a spirit of acceptance and belonging.

Letter from our Founder & CEO

If there was ever a year that tested Hello Neighbor, it was 2025.

The systems that support refugees and immigrants across the United States shifted rapidly. Policies changed. Programs paused. Funding landscapes moved under our feet. Families who had been preparing for new lives were suddenly left in uncertainty.

But something else happened this year, too.

In the middle of all that uncertainty, we witnessed something extraordinary: the enduring power of the human spirit, and the incredible generosity and kindness of the Hello Neighbor community.

Every day, our team showed up for families navigating complex and often overwhelming circumstances. Volunteers continued to mentor, tutor, and advocate. Donors stepped forward to ensure programs could continue. Community partners opened doors, offered resources, and reminded us that none of this work happens alone.

In the moments when things felt most uncertain, the Hello Neighbor community did what it has always done: **we leaned into our values.**

Since the very beginning, Hello Neighbor has been rooted in a simple but powerful idea, that belonging begins with human connection. When we welcome someone into our community, we are not just offering services or programs. We are extending friendship, dignity, and the belief that every person deserves the opportunity to build a meaningful life.

This year reminded us just how important that belief is.

Across our programs, we saw families persist through enormous challenges with courage and determination. We saw children thrive in school after months of uncertainty. We saw neighbors show up for one another in ways both big and small, sharing meals, offering rides, helping navigate complicated systems, and simply being present.

Time and again, we were reminded that kindness is not a soft idea. It is a powerful force that stabilizes communities during moments of disruption and change.

When the external environment shifted, our mission remained steady. We continued to focus on what matters most: ensuring that immigrants and refugees in our community feel welcomed, supported, and empowered to thrive. As you read this report, you will see stories of resilience, growth, and impact that were made possible by this community.

To our volunteers, partners, donors, and friends: thank you. Your commitment ensures that even in the most challenging moments, families arriving in our community are met with something stronger than uncertainty.

They are met with a neighbor.

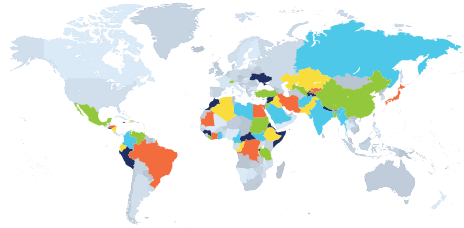

"We came to Pittsburgh from Congo 2 years ago because there was no peace in our country, so we left when we had the opportunity to come to the U.S. When we arrived, the caseworker picked us up from the airport. Hello Neighbor really helped us by being welcoming and teaching us how to live in this country. I am proud that here, my family is taken care of. I like Pittsburgh because it is peaceful, and people here care about others. My goals are to make a good life for my family here, and eventually help to support my family back home."



Education & Community Empowerment

MENTORSHIP

Our flagship program continues to foster neighbor-to-neighbor relationships that build lasting belonging. Newcomers are paired with caring Pittsburghers who provide friendship, guidance, and a warm welcome to the city. In 2025, to meet the urgency of the moment, we started onboarding mentor matches on a monthly rolling basis.

STUDY BUDDY

Study Buddy provides one-on-one virtual learning support to refugee & immigrant students in Grades 6-12. Tutors meet with students twice a week to help them navigate academic work, build confidence in the classroom, and develop their English language skills. We also host optional in-person team building events for students and tutors to connect and have fun together!

30 tutor-student pairs

95% of students said that Study Buddy helps them understand what is happening in school

Lina’s Story

Lina arrived in Pittsburgh as a refugee and joined our Study Buddy program, where she was matched with a dedicated tutor, Gina. Last June, Lina graduated as her class’s salutatorian and is now attending the University of Pittsburgh to study biology. Gina wrote to us and said this: **“I am better because I’ve gotten to know Lina. I know our country is better because Lina is here. And Pittsburgh is better because of Hello Neighbor.”**



LITTLE NEIGHBORS

Little Neighbors supports refugee and immigrant families with children ages 0–5 through early childhood events focused on learning and play. Each event offers a welcoming environment where families can engage in storytime, music, crafts, and sensory play—activities that foster school readiness and language development in a joyful, low-pressure setting. Little Neighbors is hosted at Carnegie Libraries and provides a space for families to build community and get connected to the library’s resources.

ENL CLASSES

Our English As a New Language program offers free classes to any refugee and immigrant adult learning English, helping our neighbors build their language skills to more confidently navigate daily life and participate in their community. Students meet twice a week with our dedicated instructor to learn and practice together.

Our ENL classes include practice excursions in real-life settings (like the grocery store or library)!

► DID YOU KNOW?

We use the phrase “English As a New Language (ENL)” instead of “English as a Second Language,” because many of our families already speak multiple languages before learning English!



INTERPRETATION

We maintain a large network of in-house interpreters to ensure that all our clients have equal access to services, and we aim to hire interpreters who are immigrants and refugees themselves. Language access staff also advocate for Hello Neighbor clients’ access to interpretation in medical appointments, police encounters, family-school communications, local government, and more.

Language access is legally protected by the Civil Rights Act– all federally funded programs must provide interpretation and translation to ensure full access to services.

WELLNESS

Our Wellness programming helps refugees navigate emotional stress and behavioral health through culturally and linguistically tailored support groups. Led by a bilingual liaison, groups gather to build connection and develop skills for self-care and wellness.

Focus Languages: Arabic, Dari, Swahili/French, Ukrainian

78% of participants reported feeling more connected to their community after participating in a wellness program

IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES

Thanks to the support of generous Hello Neighbor donors and funders, we were able to expand our immigration legal services to make them available to anyone in the Pittsburgh area at affordable, income-adjusted rates. The immigration legal system can be complicated and intimidating, and we’re proud to provide compassionate, friendly guidance to our community through this process.

HELLO NEIGHBOR OFFICE HOURS

Drop-in hours are offered at our office every week for clients to receive support through life's challenges. Office Hours are designed to provide practical guidance and solutions to neighbors as they navigate life in their new home.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Our employment program offers wrap-around case management and individualized services to help new neighbors overcome barriers to employment and achieve self-sufficiency. Along with assisting clients, the employment team works to build bridges with local employers to foster inclusive, accessible work environments for immigrants & refugees.

Family Health Services



SMART START

Smart Start provides culturally-tailored intensive case management support for pregnant immigrants and refugees throughout their pregnancy and up to 100 days postpartum. Services include care coordination and postpartum support, comprehensive labor planning, culturally-tailored perinatal education, and facilitating connections to community resources and support items.

96 mothers supported
(+ baby bags distributed to enrolled families to support safe and prepared newborn transitions)

1,000+ medical appointments scheduled
(Includes transportation assistance & volunteer accompaniment)

47 first-time parents served

67 babies born (+ perinatal education provided during all pregnancies through group or individual sessions)



CASE MANAGEMENT

Intensive Case Management

For refugees in especially vulnerable circumstances who require extra support, we offer **long-term, comprehensive case management** to help them overcome challenges as they adapt to life in the United States and gain the skills to address difficulties independently.

88 Clients supported

100% of clients connected to Primary Care Providers

GAPS

The GAPS program provides **short-term, transitional case management** to help new neighbors achieve self-sufficiency. With sustainability in mind, we're able to connect families and individuals more closely to their communities and the services that are available to them.

232 Clients supported

50 families received short-term rental assistance



NEW NEIGHBOR VOICES: Ali, Afghanistan

"In August 2024 I left Afghanistan and came here with my family. Hello Neighbor helped me to pay rent and find a job.

I work as a Mechanical Technician at a plastic parts manufacturer; my job is managing and controlling the robots and fixing any errors. They [my supervisors] are really kind and experienced people; they support me a lot.





CENTER FOR AFGHAN RESILIENCE

The Center for Afghan Resilience was a three year program in partnership with Bethany Christian Services from 2023 to 2026, supporting Afghan families with combat-related trauma. In 2025, **nearly 100 Afghans** came to western Pennsylvania with No One Left Behind, and we provided them with social work services (peer support, housing, case management, school enrollment) to help them adjust to their new lives, supported by the Office of Refugee Resettlement, US Dept of Health and Human Services.

94 SIVs welcomed to Pittsburgh in partnership with No One Left Behind

400+ individuals supported

97 households supported **50** individuals received 1:1 behavioral therapy

350 Individuals connected to physical health services

I've worked at this company for seven months, and I've gotten a lot of experience there. When I started, I was not really familiar with the computers, but now I am much better at working with them.

I think there are a lot of things I can be proud of. First of all, the happiness of my family. I am proud that I have my daughters, my wife, all of them here, and that we are being supported here and have a lot of assistance. I'm also proud of my job. I think I'm really improving there. Yes, there is so much to be proud of."



PROGRAMMING IN WASHINGTON COUNTY

In 2025 we celebrated the completion of our first year of services for the immigrant community in Charleroi. This program provides perinatal education and baby supplies for new and expecting moms, legal education, and social service support for Haitians and other immigrants in Washington County led by a Haitian Wellness Liaison.

Office Hours

In-person, flexible support for new neighbors, including social service navigation, distribution of basic necessities, cultural orientation on life in the U.S., legal education, and community events.

Smart Start

Low-barrier, personalized support for expecting mothers through our Smart Start program, including direct access to a case manager, guidance on navigating the medical system, education on giving birth in the U.S., and connection to pregnancy and postpartum resources.

34 moms enrolled **7** perinatal education sessions hosted **25** babies born

Legal Education

On-call legal guidance during office hours, combined with Know Your Rights education, empowering clients to more confidently navigate immigration challenges and uncertainties.

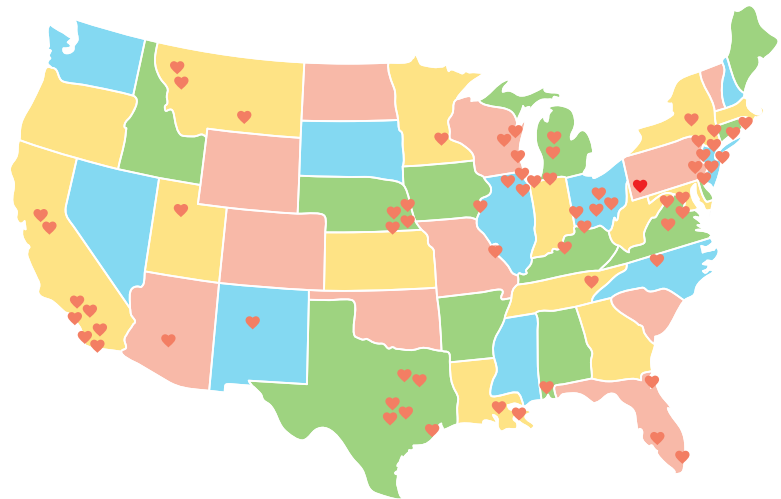
SUCCESS STORY:
Zeenath Sheikh

Zeenath and her organization, International Cultural and Relief Association (ICRA) joined the Hello Neighbor Network as a 2025 Fellow. With no paid staff and an operating budget under \$30,000, Zeenath jumped into every Network opportunity eager to learn and grow.

In June, ICRA was awarded a \$5,000 Operating Resilience Grant, which helped scale their Entrepreneurship Program. She hosted entrepreneurial classes for over 25 immigrant women, equipping them with tech tools, business memberships, and hands-on training to launch and grow their businesses.

Today, Zeenath and ICRA continue to support these female entrepreneurs through ongoing mentorship, access to a local Women’s Business Center, and a growing peer network.

Hello Neighbor Network



The Hello Neighbor Network, powered by Hello Neighbor, is a coalition of grassroots organizations working with refugees and immigrants in the U.S. that comes together to grow and strengthen connections between communities and new neighbors.

Thanks to our supporters, we were able to spend over \$17,000 at these wonderful immigrant-owned businesses!



Mother's Day

We hosted a heartwarming afternoon of Mother's Day fun at Carrick Library for families in our Little Neighbors program. Families enjoyed tea, treats, and creative fun, and our littlest neighbors got to make cards and arrange bouquets for their moms.



Neighborhood Nosh

Our supporters showed up for our biggest fundraising event of the year, where we celebrated our impact & community partners with a lively evening spotlighting cuisine from immigrant-owned restaurants. Guests were treated to delicious food from Chaykhana, Cilantro y Ajo, Geppetto Cafe, Jaks Bakery, Nan Xiang Dumplings, Novaria Coffee, and Secretos de Mis Abuelos, and our neighborhood of support showed up to raise an incredible \$100,000 to fund our services for immigrant & refugee neighbors.

The Children's Museum of Pittsburgh generously opened their doors after hours to welcome over 250 of our neighbors for a night of play, exploration, food, and connection. For many families, it was their very first visit to the museum!

"Running to Stand Still" Film Screening

We hosted a free screening and discussion for Director & Producer Robert Bilheimer's documentary short film "Running to Stand Still: Migrants Search for Hope in the Promised Land", which captures the stories of migrants seeking asylum at the U.S./Mexico border. "Running" seeks to put a human face on the realities of immigration today by telling stories from migrants themselves: courageous, dignified human beings whose lives stand as a powerful rebuke to alarmist rhetoric.



Neighborhood Museum Days

So many of our neighbors got to experience joyful outings at Carnegie Museums of Art and Natural History at Neighborhood Museum Days! These events brought together families from specific language groups, allowing them to explore the museums while connecting with neighbors with shared backgrounds. The museum makes a continuous effort to make their collections accessible to our neighbors through free family memberships, interpretation services, and translated museum guides.

Our Neighborhood Steps Up: Resettlement & Emergency Housing Fund

At the beginning of the year, our Resettlement Team worked tirelessly to welcome **112 new arrivals from 20 families** in just one month ahead of the suspension of the Refugee Resettlement program. Our team picked up each new arrival at the airport and got to work helping families settle into their new homes, from finding housing to connecting them with medical care, English classes, and other critical resources.

This influx came alongside the federal funding freeze, and we turned to our neighborhood of support for help securing safe, comfortable housing for each family.

When we asked for help, our neighborhood showed up. **239 donors raised over \$30,000** to keep our neighbors housed and provide essential furnishings, and volunteers offered a helping hand and assisted our team to prepare homes for families. Thank you to everyone who stepped up to make sure our new neighbors have a place to call home.

THEIR STORIES:

Snapshots of families who were safely housed thanks to contributions to the Emergency Housing Fund:

From Syria: A father who is quadriplegic, a mother 32 weeks pregnant, and their two small children. This support gave them vital stability while they navigated medical appointments, school enrollments, and adjusting to the city.

From the Democratic Republic of the Congo: A mother of seven who was able to move out of temporary housing and into a place to call home.

From Afghanistan: A family who arrived just before the holidays, with a newborn baby and a 4-year-old. While the parents worked with our employment team to find jobs, the housing fund ensured they had stability in their new home.

From Sudan: A single mother raising three children, one still a toddler. Our community made sure she did not have to take on this journey alone.

Awards & Appearances

Sloane Davidson Honored in 2025 L’Oreal Paris Women of Worth

Founder and CEO Sloane Davidson was named one of ten exceptional women leaders in the non-profit sector in the program’s special 20th Anniversary celebration. This incredible honor included a \$25,000 grant to support our services and a national stage to amplify our mission, with a spread in **Vogue**, a red carpet interview with Sophia Bush hosted by **Vanity Fair**, and a feature in **Live with Kelly & Mark**. This milestone moment is a testament to our growth: from a dinner shared with one family to serving over **1,500 neighbors** in the past year alone.

Hello Neighbor at Global Refugee Forum

We were incredibly honored to represent Hello Neighbor in Geneva, Switzerland, at the Global Refugee Forum. Our Founder and CEO Sloane Davidson served as a delegate with Refugee Council USA, joining an extraordinary group of leaders working to make our country a welcoming place for refugees. We were profoundly grateful for the opportunity to learn from world leaders and bring those global insights back home to our own community.

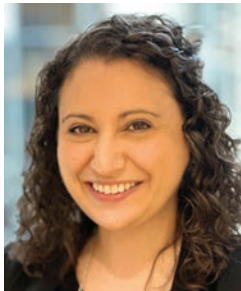

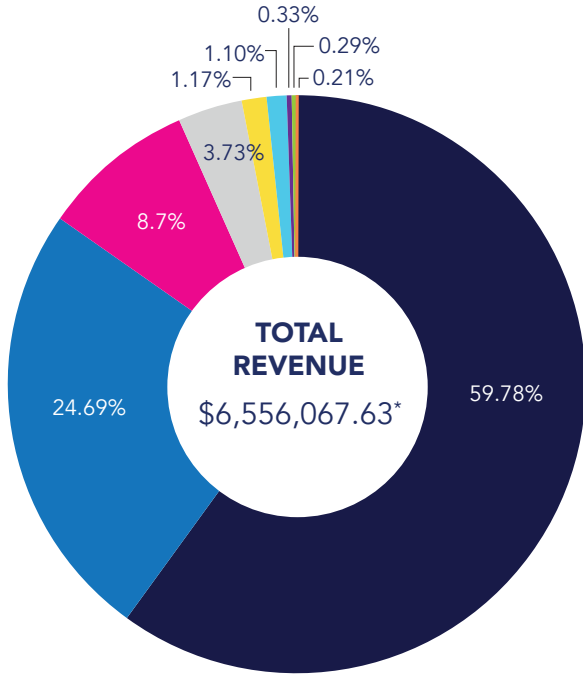

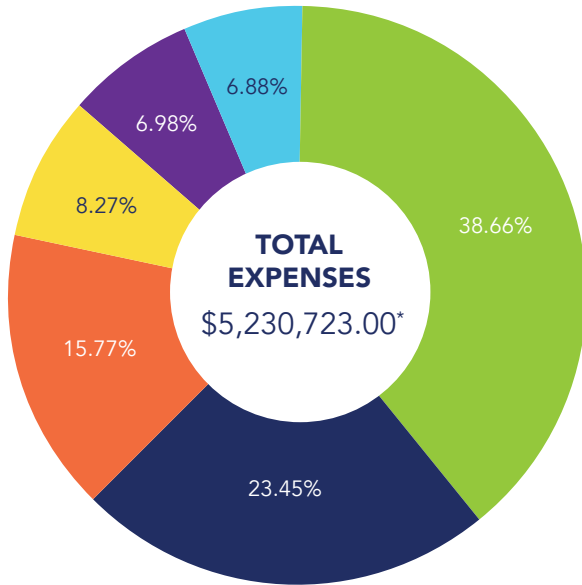
