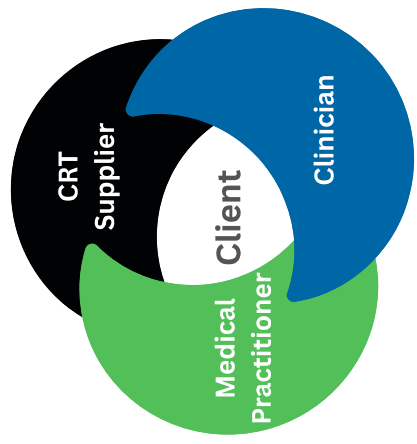

COMPLEX REHAB TECHNOLOGY (CRT) PROCESS: ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES



During the CRT provision process, every role matters. Together, we make a difference through our shared commitment and unique expertise.

Client

The individual seeking new, replacement, or modified CRT (along with their support system, which may include family, caregivers, and other care team members) remains at the center of the process. Their needs, goals, and active participation guide optimal outcomes.

Medical Practitioner

The medical practitioner—typically an MD, DO, NP, or PA—initiates the order for a specialty equipment evaluation, reviews and provides concurrence with the evaluation recommendations, and completes a face-to-face visit for the equipment when required.

Clinician

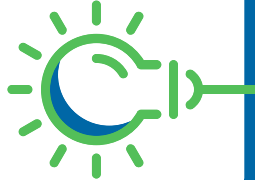
The clinician, typically a PT or OT, is the individual who identifies the necessary features of a mobility device through a comprehensive client assessment. They work with the client to set functional goals and serve as an impartial team member, with no financial ties to the sale of the CRT. Specialized training and expertise in seating and wheeled mobility are required.

CRT Supplier

The supplier includes an Assistive Technology Professional (ATP) and a support team. The supplier-ATP is the product specialist whose primary role is to align the technology features recommended by the clinician with the appropriate equipment. The supplier manages the ordering process, coordinates payment, often through insurance, and ensures ongoing service and support for the device.

What is CRT?

Complex Rehab Technology (CRT) products include medically necessary, individually configured devices that require evaluation, configuration, fitting, adjustment or programming. These include products such as individually configured manual or power wheelchairs, seating and positioning systems, and other adaptive equipment such as standing devices and gait trainers.
