You will be evaluated on your solution to the case study, how you incorporate the performance indicators of this event and how you demonstrate the career competencies.

CASE STUDY SITUATION

You are the owner of **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS**, a local business that provides children age 3-12 years old with tumbling and gymnastic skills. The business is located in a strip mall in a busy suburban neighborhood and provides boys and girls skills that develop strength, flexibility and gymnastic skills including forward and backward rolls, cartwheels, handstands, backbends, jumps and balance beam walks.

STEP ONE GYMNASTICS offers classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and on the weekends. Given the size of the leased space, **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** is not able to offer as many skill building options as other gyms. **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** does not offer instruction on pommel horse, rings, parallel and uneven bars or vault due to the lack of space. Parents love **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** and rave about the staff but view it as a starting point for their children and eventually move on to different gyms that have additional equipment.

At first you were disappointed when students moved on from **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** to larger gyms, but later realized that being the first step in a child's gymnastics journey is rewarding and parents appreciate the slower immersion into the sport. All class sessions are at full capacity and there is always a waiting list, so the limitations on skill building do not hinder enrollment.

YOUR CHALLENGE

Due to the success of **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** an investor has offered additional funding. The investor has provided the funding with two options for its use:

Option 1: Add additional classes to the weekly schedule at **STEP ONE GYMNASTICS** so that it is open seven days a week and can accommodate more students.

Option 2: Lease a larger space for the business that would allow for additional skill building.

You will meet with the investor to discuss the following:

- Costs and resources to consider associated with each option
- Benefits and risks with each option
- Possible effects on current staff and customers
- Plan for use of additional funding

- The maximum score for the evaluation is 100 points. The presentation will be weighted twice (2 times) the average of the exam score.
