What is the Pride in Place Programme?

Pride in Place is the government's new plan to see transformative change in the UK's most disadvantaged communities, by investing in local infrastructure and services. 284 locations have been selected to receive £5.8bn, meaning £20 million each over the next 10 years. Funding decisions are made by Neighbourhood Boards, led by a Chair.

How can faith communities engage?

- 1) Apply for funding! Some areas have already established Neighbourhood Boards and created opportunities.
- 2) For areas who don't have a Board yet, you could apply to become a member and influence decision-making.
- 3) Respond to local consultations, so your unique insights, relationships, and experiences are reflected in outcomes.
- 4) From Autumn 26 you can join Network for Neighbourhoods, a national peer-learning platform around Pride in Place.
