Registration types

There are different options available to members that are determined by the age you turn in the year you are playing. Here is a quick overview https://www.narellannc.com.au/about-netball

Players who are turning **age 5-9 in 2026** and are either new or returning to Netball, can participate in the **NetSetGo** program. This is the introductory pathway to netball and introduces players to netball skills and fundamentals, from the ground up.

Net Clinic – players turning 5-7 years of age in 2026

- An introduction to netball activities/skills and fundamentals
- Net clinic will run on a Wednesday night from 5-6pm during Term 2, Starting 29 April 2026
- No Narellan Netball Club uniform is required, a NetSetGo shirt will be provided as part of your registration

Set - players turning 8 in 2026

- Skills/modified competition
- Start to apply the skills learnt in the Net clinic on court with modified rules
- Games are played on a Saturday morning
- A NNC uniform is required and can be purchased during registration

Go – players turning 9 in 2026

- Both modified and full competition netball, advanced continuation of the Set competition
- Games are played on a Saturday morning
- A NNC uniform is required and can be purchased during registration

The below registrations are available to players who are turning 10+ in 2026. Players wanting to join our NNC community should complete this Narellan Netball Club 2026 EOI - New to Club

Juniors – players turning 10 to 17 years of age in 2026

- Junior players may be required to attend our club grading days, please review our NNC Grading Policy
- Players will be required to train on the designated training day and work with a team coach
- An overview of CDNA Competition Rules will give you an overview of the competition

Senior Division – players turning 18 and over in 2026 (players turning 16 and over in 2026 are eligible to play in senior division with parent consent)

- A team link will be provided to the team delegate should they have minimum 8 players to register.
 Please email nncregistrar@outlook.com and nncpresident@outlook.com and the team delegate will be sent a team link to share
- Team delegates will be the point of contact between the club and the team. This is especially important around forfeits, kit bag responsibility and other game day requirements.
- If you are an individual player looking to register with a team, please complete this <u>Narellan Netball</u> <u>Club 2026 Seniors EOI</u> form and we will place you on a waiting list with others looking to form teams.

- Training is at the discretion of senior teams; Wednesday nights is our clubs designated training night, should you wish to request a court for training please contact narellannc@outlook.com

Registration Fees

Senior player (16+) - \$264 Junior Player (10 - 17 years) - \$243 SetGo 8 - 9 years (competition) - \$171 (A \$25 subsidy will be provided by CDNA on registration) Net Clinic 5 - 7 years (Net Clinic) - \$135

*Remember, Active Kids will reduce registration fees if applied so be sure to claim your voucher/s, if eligible, before you register

How to register

Registration can be completed via the PlayHQ website. If you had not done so previously, you will be required to create an account, following the prompts.

A registration link will be shared to returning members via email prior to the 4th January 2026 and we ask to be completed by 20th Jan. From 20th January 2026, new members will have the ability to fill a position. New members are requested to complete this Narellan Netball Club 2026 EOI - New to Club to register their interest. This information will not be used for any other purpose other than to plan for registration in 2026 and will not be shared. When registration opens, the email address provided will allow NNC to share a registration link directly to you, if we can accommodate. This will allow NNC to plan resources such as coaches, etc and not compromise the experience we aim to give our members

Before you register, we recommend you apply for an Active Kids voucher, if you are eligible. Visit the Service NSW Website where you can claim your Active Kids voucher which will contribute \$50 to your registration costs. Your will be prompted to input your voucher code at the end of the online registration process, where the voucher will be applied.

An in-person registration day will be held at Narellan Sports Hub 18th Jan 2026 & 21st Jan 2026. The committee will fit you for a training shirt (paid for by the club) as well as have uniforms available for try on. You can use this opportunity to ask any questions you might have, meet the committee and ask questions on coaching and umpiring.

Training

CDNA and clubs have agreed to dedicated training nights. Training is on a Wednesday night at the Narellan Sports Hub, with times to be determined by the coaches once teams are announced. Any exceptions to this will be managed by the team coach/manager and members directly after coaching coordinator and CDNA approval.

The Net clinic will run on the Wednesday night also at the Narellan Sports Hub

Grading

Grading is a key part of the season and formation of teams. It is undertaken each year, to understand a player's level of skill and in turn, allow us to form teams with players of similar skill. There are several guidelines Narellan Netball Club follow, allowing for a fair and objective process.

Once players/teams are graded, they are assigned a division. These teams submitted to CDNA, and it is to their discretion to approve and allocate teams to the most suitable division of the competition – the intent is to have teams of similar skill playing one another. Narellan Netball Club will communicate to all involved once teams are formed and CDNA has finalised their process.

More information on grading days will be shared closer to the date. The NNC grading policy can be found on our website here, on our Governance page. The policy explains who is required to attend grading and how it is managed.

Uniforms

NNC uniforms can be ordered online as part of the online registration process. Any uniform enquiries can be directed to our uniform coordinator at nncuniforms@outlook.com

NOTE: Net Clinic players are not required to order a uniform. As part of the Net clinic registration, you will be provided with a shirt to play in.

All clubs have a uniform policy that is approved by CDNA. Narellan Netball Club have a few options to ensure we open the game to all possible:

- 1. Dress and black Valour Active training briefs
- 2. Game shirt and black Valour Active long tights
- 3. Black/white/pink socks

Players in the SetGO (8-9 years) are allowed to wear a black, long sleeve top under their dress/shirt.

Our Uniform Policy shows what is acceptable, but we encourage you to reach out to our uniform coordinator if you have questions or concerns at nncuniforms@outlook.com

Uniforms are ordered as part of registration, and you can pay for the registration and uniform in the 1 transaction with credit card.

There can be up to 8-12 weeks lead time for uniforms so we ask for orders to be placed at the time of registration to ensure they are received before the season commences.

<u>Uniforms costs are:</u>

Club Dress - \$88 Club short tights - \$38.50 Game Shirt - \$38.50 Club long tights - \$77

Merchandise costs are:

Cap - \$27.50 Supporter Shirt - \$49 Hoodie - \$77 Supporter Jacket - \$95

Coaching/Umpiring

NNC relies on support from volunteers to run all aspects of the club. From committee, coaches, managers, umpires and general activities, our netball community is a key part of the club's success.

Teams in the SetGO and Junior Divisions will have a coach appointed to them. Coaches vary in levels of skill and experience and as a club, we do our best to support their development and, provide them with resources to deliver the best coaching possible. We ask members to remember however, that coaches are volunteers and we are reliant on them giving their time.

Umpires will be appointed by the club to each game played and as above, vary in levels of skill and experience. Umpire competency is determined by their level of badging and this determines the standard of game they can umpire. Mentors will work with coaches to grow their skills over time and we ask members to remember that umpires also are volunteers and we are reliant on them giving their time.

In 2026, NNC are investing in the further development of coaching and umpiring pathways. We would encourage anyone who has an interest in coaching or umpiring to contact the club coordinators to have a discussion and if suitable, get involved.
