#### ChurchWorks Family Hubs Toolkit Launch Event

One of ChurchWorks' key aims over the last 3 years has been exploring

opportunities for the church to be involved in the future of Family Hubs, whether through support, co-delivery or colocation.

We are delighted to have worked collaboratively with ChurchWorks partners Spurgeons and the Gather Movement to produce an online Family Hubs toolkit. The toolkit will equip both Local Authorities



and churches with an understanding of one another's assets, a shared language and vision, and next steps for collaboration. We hope to make a case for the important role that faith groups play in local communities, and therefore why Local Authorities should consider partnering with them on Family Hubs. The toolkit also provides clear next steps for churches to take in building and navigating relationships with local authorities. At our online launch, we will celebrate the production of this resource, share more of its content and outline plans for the distribution of the toolkit.

# Report finds 420+ church-led projects supporting vulnerable people in Bristol

The Bristol Thriving Communities report, released on 28th May by Good Faith Partnership and Christian Action Bristol, analysed 195 churches in the city, finding 427 individual church-led social transformation projects ranging from support for children, mental health and wellbeing



provision, to providing community cafes and support to those in food insecurity.

This report builds upon the Bristol Churches Covid Recovery Report, published by Good Faith Partnership in 2022, which identified an increased appetite of churches to collectively address city-wide issues following the pandemic.

Recommendations to overcome these barriers were co-designed with church leaders in a <u>workshop</u> to inform the priorities of the Bristol Thriving Communities team moving forward. These practical next steps include: developing models of economic redistribution to target areas of greatest need, stronger local coordination to encourage collaboration and overcome human resource constraints, and creating more opportunities for churches <u>to engage</u> as a strategic delivery partner with Bristol City Council in tackling key city challenges.

#### **Sanctuary Youth Series**

Mental health challenges in youth are prevalent and on the rise: depression and anxiety among young people doubled since the pandemic in the US. One in five young people in the UK will

experience a mental health challenge. Over 1.5 million youth in Canada live with a mental health challenge.

We believe there is a vital need for youth to be able to talk about mental health and receive support and companionship in their faith communities. Barna's latest research, The Open Generation Report, reveals that mental health is one of the greatest concerns for young people, and that they want to attend churches that prioritize this issue. Springtide Research Institute—a sociological research institute in the United States solely dedicated to young people ages thirteen to twenty-five—reports similar findings: "mental health, it turns out, is the biggest issue to address in order to do ministry that matters for young people."

At Sanctuary, our hope is that the next generation will experience the Church as a supportive place, and that youth ministry leaders, parents/caregivers, and youth will all be equipped to have conversations about mental health. This is why we have developed *The Sanctuary Youth Series*.
