From Insight to Action: Tools and Talks for Change



We're delighted to announce an inspiring line-up of speakers for the Summit.

The day will be hosted by **Justin Brierley** and **Swarzy Shire**. Justin brings over 20 years' experience as a writer, broadcaster, and podcaster, widely known for hosting *Unbelievable?* and for fostering thoughtful, intelligent dialogue around faith, culture, and belief. Joining him as co-host, Swarzy, a London-based broadcaster and creative, familiar to audiences from BBC Radio 1, 1Xtra, and Radio 4, and known for her dynamic presence at the intersection of media, culture, and Christian faith. Together, they promise insightful conversation, warmth, and energy throughout the event.

The Summit will begin with an Opening Keynote from a Government representative (TBC), offering a timely perspective on Church–Government partnerships and the role faith can play in shaping public life. This will be followed by a Question Time session with the **Faith Minister, Miatta Fahnbulleh MP, Minister for Devolution, Faith and Communities**.

We'll close the day with a powerful Closing Keynote from **Bishop Mike Royal**, General Secretary of Churches Together in England and ChurchWorks Commissioner.

Panel Discussions: Learning from Experience

At the heart of the Summit are three panel discussions, bringing together church leaders, MPs, practitioners and sector specialists to explore areas where churches are already making a tangible difference – and where partnership matters most.

Promoting Wellbeing Panel



Revd Charles Kawku-Odoi – CEO of the Caribbean and African Health Network, highlighting culturally informed approaches to health and wellbeing.

Pastor Sian Wade – Lead Pastor of Bridge Church, Lincoln (Assemblies of God), offering practical insight into church-led wellbeing and community support

Professor Sir Sam Everington OBE – President of the Royal College of General Practitioners, sharing deep frontline experience and insight into the future of primary care.

Olivia Amartey – Executive Director of Elim Churches, bringing a national faith perspective on supporting churches and communities across the UK.

Dr Zubir Ahmed MP – Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Health Innovation and Safety, bringing a national policy perspective on health, prevention and innovation.

This panel brings together faith leaders, healthcare professionals, and policymakers to explore how community-based approaches can promote wellbeing, strengthen prevention, and shape the future of health through collaboration between churches and public services.

Tackling Poverty Panel




The Rt Hon Sir Stephen Timms MP – Minister of State for Social Security and Disability, offering a government perspective on social support and poverty reduction.
