



## October Newsletter

On the 10th October we will mark [World Mental Health Day](#) – a reminder that mental wellbeing is every bit as vital as physical health. Every year in England, 1 in 4 people will face a mental health challenge, yet only a third of those will receive any form of treatment. Without the right support, many struggle to live well, sustain employment, build relationships, and take part fully in community life.

As churches, we have an important part to play in responding to this challenge. Sometimes the simplest gestures – a warm smile, the offer of a cup of tea, or simply providing a safe space to be with others, can make all the difference to someone's day. Earlier this year, our report on [Creating a National Healthcare Service](#) highlighted how faith groups can be part of the solution to the wider healthcare crisis, offering networks, resources, and holistic support both for individuals and for those working in social prescribing. We encourage you to read through our [how-to guides](#) to see what activities your churches are already running that can be a support to those who may need it.

This call to care feels especially urgent in light of the recent riots and scenes of fragmentation across the country. The witness of the Church as a place of peace and welcome has never been more needed. God's commandment to *love our neighbour as ourselves* reminds us of the heart of our calling: to serve God by serving others, bringing hope and light, just as Jesus did.

So this month, let us be mindful of those who might appreciate a simple check-in. A friendly chat, a shared cup of tea, or the simple question, "*How are you?*" can mean more than we realise. Small acts of kindness can shine light in even the darkest seasons. Let us also remember what our churches have to offer to the community and those who need it the most.

## Report Launch: The role of heritage buildings on community wellbeing in a 'decade of renewal'

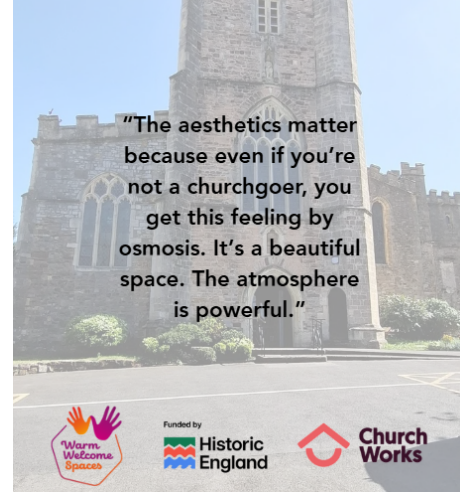
**Thursday 27th November 2025**

The Children and Families Alliance – [Safe Families](#) and [Home for Good, Kids Matter](#), and [Transforming Lives for Good](#) – have launched *More Than Sundays*, a powerful new report highlighting how churches are already delivering vital care and support for children and families, and how they can do even more.

Through a network of nearly 7,000 volunteers, this work has supported 33,000 children, 12,000 families, and equipped over 1,800 carers, with

life-changing impact in homes, schools, prisons, and communities.
