From ancient manuscripts to archeology to the methodologies used to affirm the Bible's veracity, you will be taught *why* you can fully trust that the Bible is historically reliable and doctrinally definitive as the Word of God.

Course Goal:

1. To equip you with a comprehensive understanding of the manuscript data behind the biblical text.
2. To challenge you to critically examine the evidence supporting the Bible's history and doctrine.
3. To experience confidence in the Bible as you're equipped with historical insights to your faith.
4. To enhance your ability to articulate the foundations of biblical reliability and its implications for Christian doctrine.
