| <b>Bold.org</b>                         | Scholarships for high school students, college students, graduate students, and specific majors/interests.     |

Start with 3–4 databases rather than trying to use every site. Not required, but recommended: You can create a dedicated scholarship email address, complete the profiles carefully, and keep a spreadsheet tracking the scholarship name, deadline, requirements, essay, recommendation letters, and application status. You should never pay to apply for a scholarship.

Scholarship eligibility does not stop once you graduate from high school. Continue applying for scholarships throughout college using the resources above or checking available scholarships on your college/university website.
