

# Conservation and anti-poaching

“Every person has the duty to protect the natural resources of the United Republic...”

## Article 27 of The Constitution of the United Republic of Tanzania

A hard earned indication of anti-poaching success is a lack of signs of poaching - a greatly satisfying inability to collect evidence of illegal activities, due to them now occurring at very low or nonexistent levels. We are therefore proud that we do not have more photographs to show, other than one poached Giraffe and some Acacia burning and charcoal kilns.

Few hunting companies in Tanzania can match the successful anti-poaching track record and wildlife population recovery achieved in the concessions that Michel Mantheakis currently manages or those he managed in the past. It is not simply a matter of investing money in anti-poaching efforts; it is about ensuring that the investment translates into tangible, meaningful results. It takes a dedicated conservation ethos and acumen to create the best results and we are very proud of our staff and our achievements.

We started our full-time anti-poaching efforts in December 2012 in cooperation with the Lukwati/Piti Game Reserve Authority who provide 2 to 4 Game Scouts per team. In 2014 we bought 2 boats and started a second all-year round joint anti-poaching team to deal with the poachers coming from across Lake Rukwa which we border for 40 km. The determined efforts of our 2 teams have brought poaching down from previously alarming to now negligible levels. In the years


since, our successes are phenomenal and the wildlife has increased tremendously.

In Longido GCA we have 2 full time all-year round anti-poaching teams, with each team containing 2 Unit Game Scouts or District Game Scouts. Thanks to their dedicated efforts and strong, consistent presence, we can earnestly say we have controlled poaching to the level where it is now a rare occurrence. Giraffes are now plentiful, big cat tracks are appearing more regularly, and elephants are more comfortably using the available quality habitats according to their seasonal needs.

Without our hunting clientele none of this would have been possible, and we thank them for their patronage. Our hunters generate the necessary incentive and funding for our determined and successful, ongoing anti-poaching efforts.

As custodians of our natural inheritance, what gives us the right to hunt is this continuous commitment to protect and conserve the wildlife and its habitat for future generations. We should never forget this moral obligation and we certainly have not. Even in these times of wildlife flourishing, we must persevere with a strong guard and never ceasing patrols.

For us, sustainable trophy hunting is wildlife conservation, and it absolutely requires persistent devotion to curbing poaching.

# Corporate Social Responsibility

Community development is not just a Government requirement for outfitters in Tanzania; it is an important conservation strategy and our corporate social responsibility. We are not just outfitters; we are stewards of change using the benefits of hunting to transform lives and safeguard our wildlife.

Protecting our wildlife means addressing the root cause—poverty. Our corporate social responsibility programs are rooted in this principle; by sharing the benefits of hunting we discourage the local communities with whom we share our wildlife concessions from otherwise turning to poaching as a means of subsistence.

In order to build the bridge out of poverty, we channel the proceeds from hunting towards meaningful projects that serve the entire community such as health, education and clean water. We are achieving our goal to create the necessary awareness within the local community that wildlife is a precious natural resource that needs continuous protection for their own long-term benefit.

One of our newest and long-term projects is the Neema Foundation, a charity which financially supports the widows and families of deceased wildlife rangers who were killed during anti-poaching operations. Since their widows and children are often left without a breadwinner, we are setting up a project to cover their living costs, health and education expenses as well as other basic amenities to ensure their wellbeing and the futures of the children. These rangers have donated their lives to wildlife conservation so the least we can do is support their families in exchange.

When you hunt with us, you will enjoy the satisfaction in knowing that you are truly contributing to the betterment of lives of those less privileged: the key stakeholders, and our partners in wildlife and habitat conservation.


Together with our local communities we are the guardians who conserve wildlife and its habitat for future generations of hunters.







# Longido Game Control Area

The opportunity to hunt this great concession offers you not only a **wide selection of Masai species**, but also offers you good trophy quality in highest success rate and availability of game while enjoying a stunning landscape.

This superb Masailand hunting concession is 578sq km (223sq mile) and located in northern Tanzania, bordering with Kenya. The area starts on the Kenyan border then extends south towards Arusha on the eastern side of the Arusha-Nairobi Road and is dominated by the impressive 2,629 metre (8,625 feet) Longido Mountain in the center. It is surrounded by mostly gentle rolling Acacia woodlands with belts of thickets and open plains. Longido Mountain starts with woodland slopes that turn to thicket and then into cool condensation forest at the top. Longido GCA is enriched being part of the dispersal area of the world famous Amboseli National Park in Kenya that is very close by. From our Longido Camp you have amazing views of Mt Kilimanjaro and Mt Meru.

Bird hunters can enjoy great wing shooting opportunities for several species of Quail, Sand Grouse, Dove, Francolins and Guinea Fowl, which enhances the experience of hunting these very special areas.

Being in close proximity to Arusha allows for an inexpensive, beautiful transfer by car to camp. Last, but not least; with the best game viewing parks in Africa, namely Ngorongoro Crater, Serengeti, Lake Manyara and Tarangire National Parks in the near vicinity, Longido GCA offers you a great opportunity to combine top quality game viewing with your hunting safari, and most of our clients take advantage of this opportunity.





# Muhesi Game Reserve

We are very fortunate to have acquired this great concession in the November 2024 auction. Muhesi Game Reserve is 2,633sq km of pristine wilderness and used to be part of the Kizigo/Muhesi Game Reserve in Western Tanzania, but now has its own independent management authority that focus entirely on this concession alone. This and the intensified anti-poaching operations has contributed greatly to the improvement of the game population.

The concession is gently undulating, between 800 meters above sea level to 1,400 meters and dominated by 5 larger hills and several large seasonal rivers. The area is enriched with a diversity of vegetation from Miombo woodland interspersed with thickets, to open grassland plains and Acacia woodland. This area is famous for the abundance of Leopard, the quality of Lion and very good quality hunting for Greater Kudu, Lesser Kudu, Roan, East African Sable, Livingstone Eland, Cape Buffalo, Lichtenstein's Hartebeest, Southern Impala, Warthog, Bushpig, Chobe Bushbuck, Kirks Dik Dik, Common Duiker, Oribi, Klipspringer, Grysbok and Yellow Baboon.

Muhesi Game Reserve has a private airstrip and is reachable by charter from Dar es Salaam or from Arusha.

# *Ugalla East Game Reserve & Ugunda WMA*

## **UGALLA EAST GAME RESERVE**

Ugalla East Game Reserve, is 1,865 sqkm located south of Tabora and, besides having its own airstrip, it is easily accessible by scheduled flight to Tabora and a scenic 3.5 hrs drive to camp. This is flat Miombo woodland interspersed with large open plains and contains 2 main rivers that stop flowing in the dry season leaving very large pools that attract a plethora of wildlife in the dry season. Ugalla E Game Reserve is an excellent area for well-maned Lion, Leopard, Buffalo, Crocodile, East African Sable, Roan, Greater Kudu, Livingstone's Eland, Topi, Warthog, Southern Reedbuck, Bushpig, Chobe Bushbuck, and Defassa Waterbuck.

## **UGUNDA WMA**

Ugunda WMA, acquired in 2018, is a community area that borders our Ugalla E GR, and is also located south of Tabora. It has its own airstrip as well and is also easily accessible by scheduled flight to Tabora with a 2.5 hrs scenic drive to camp. Ugunda WMA vegetation is flat belts of Miombo woodland interspersed with large plains with permanent pools of water in the dry season, and is part of the Ugalla Game Reserve dispersal area. The dedicated conservation efforts has transformed it from a marginal hunting area into a very productive hunting concession with increasing wildlife populations. The game available here are good quality Lion, and it is excellent for Leopard, Buffalo Hippo, Crocodile, East African Sable, Roan, Greater Kudu, Livingstone's Eland, Topi, Warthog, Southern Reedbuck, Bushpig, Chobe Bushbuck and Defassa Waterbuck.



## TERMS OF BUSINESS

- A deposit of 50% of the safari rate is required to confirm your booking. Full payment for your safari, together with the Trophy Fee deposit, must be received 90 days prior to the commencement of your safari. No safari will commence without full payment and trophy fee deposit.
- With any cancellation occurring more than 90 days from the start of the safari, the deposit will be re-funded only if the safari is re-sold and a 20% administration fee will be deducted.
- Any cancellation occurring **90 days** or less from the start of the safari no refund will be granted save for any Trophy Fee Deposit payment made. **It is highly recommended to get Trip Cancellation Insurance to cover yourself from any unexpected cancellation.**
- Game Trophy Fees and all Government Royalties charged will be those applicable to the year the safari is taken regardless of what is quoted on the initial contract. Invoices and quotes are subject to change based on any change in Government fees and/or Game Trophy Fees.
- Force Majeure, (meaning acts of God, explosion, floods, tempest, fire or accident, war, threat of war, sabotage, insurrection, civil disturbance, government intervention, weather conditions or other untoward occurrences). Any Government decision in regards to Michel Mantheakis Safaris Ltd is considered Force Majeure in this context. In the event of Force Majeure, the company is entitled to vary or cancel any itinerary or arrangement. Although all endeavors shall be made to reimburse you, refunds are solely to the discretion of the company.
- Trophies will only be shipped after full trophy payment has been received.
- Trophy Fees are applicable to **ALL** Game shot, **including** those wounded and lost.
- Upon the end of your safari, the final invoice, reflecting all additional charges or refunds will be send to you by email as soon as possible.
- All payments are payable in cash or by wire transfer.

## LICENSING REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

- The hunting season in Tanzania starts July 1 and ends June 30 of the following year.
- No shooting from vehicle or chasing animals with car.
- No hunting of female, young or immature animal is allowed.
- Hunting is only to be conducted in the daylight hours.
- The Tanzanian Wildlife Department allows the following game to be hunted only on a 21-day license (Premium package): Elephant; Lion; Leopard; Oryx; Greater Kudu; Lesser Kudu; Sitatunga; Gerenuk; Sable; Roan.
- **The minimum legal length for Leopard** is 130 cm (51.2 inches) from tip of nose to base of tail
- **The minimum legal for Elephant** is 160 cm length (63 inches) of tusk or 20 kg weight (44.09 pounds).
- **The legal minimum legal age for Lion** is 6 years old.
- Minimum caliber for dangerous game is .375 (93mm). Hunting with handgun, automatic and semi-automatic weapons is strictly forbidden.
- A maximum of 3 Rifles and 1 shotgun per hunter and 100 rounds per rifle can be imported.

## INSURANCE

**We strongly recommend that you obtain the following types of insurance:**

- Accidental Death and Disability
- Loss or theft of personal effects.
- Emergency Evacuation.
- Medical – Make sure it covers you in Africa.
- Trip Cancellation. Please purchase this policy immediately after booking your hunt to safeguard yourself.

**Please make sure your policies are up to date and you are fully insured before you travel.**
