A Premier Hunting Destination

Namibia is widely regarded as one of Africa's most respected and rewarding hunting destinations. Its vast open landscapes, free-range game, political stability, and strong conservation ethic make it a top choice for international sportsmen seeking an authentic African safari experience.

Covering more than 824,000 km², Namibia offers incredible diversity — from open savannah plains and rolling bushveld to rugged mountains and desert fringes. With a population of just over 3 million people, hunters enjoy true wilderness, wide horizons, and uncrowded hunting areas rarely found elsewhere in Africa.

Travel & Access

Namibia is one of the easiest African countries for U.S. hunters to reach. Travelers typically route through Johannesburg or Frankfurt, with smooth connections into Hosea Kutako International Airport, located just outside Windhoek. Firearm import procedures are well organized, and professional outfitters assist with permits and airport handling.

Once in Namibia, a well-maintained road network, reliable domestic flights, and professional transfer services ensure comfortable travel to hunting areas.

Safety & Medical Standards

Namibia offers modern medical facilities, private hospitals, and experienced medical professionals in major towns. A nationwide 24-hour emergency evacuation service operates with fully equipped ambulances and aircraft, providing peace of mind for international guests.

Hunting Season

Namibia's primary hunting season runs from February through November, with peak trophy months typically from May to September, when cooler temperatures and dry conditions create ideal tracking and hunting opportunities.

Weather:

Namibia is usually sunny 300 days of the year with rainfall from November to March.

- **Summer** (Nov–Mar): Warm to hot days, 77–105°F, with occasional refreshing rain showers.
- **Autumn** (Apr–May): Mild and pleasant, 68–86°F.
- **Winter** (Jun–Aug): Cool, dry days at 64–77°F, with cold mornings and evenings.
- **Spring** (Sep–Oct): Warm and dry, 77–105°F, with excellent game movement.

Low humidity, clear skies, and long daylight hours make Namibia ideal for hunting and safari travel throughout the year.



Important Safari Information:



Visa Requirements:

U.S. citizens require a visa for Namibia (*effective 1 April 2025*).

Visas may be obtained online in advance via the MHAISS e-Services Portal (recommended) or as a Visa on Arrival at major airports and border posts. Tourist visas are valid for up to 90 days.

Requirements:

- Passport valid for at least 6 months
- Minimum three blank pages
- Travel for tourism or private visit only
- Children may require special birth certificates or parental affidavits.

We strongly recommend applying online prior to travel to avoid delays.



Health Information:

All our Professional Hunters are certified in first aid, and our camps are equipped with comprehensive medical and first-aid supplies.

Our hunting areas are not situated in malaria zones; however, malaria precautions are advised if you plan to visit Northern Namibia, such as Etosha National Park or the Zambezi Region.

Guests should bring:

- Personal medication for common ailments
- Any prescription medication
- High-factor sunscreen



Rifle Importation for U.S. Hunters:

U.S. citizens may legally bring hunting rifles into Namibia under a **temporary firearm import permit** issued by the Namibian Police. On arrival at Hosea Kutako International Airport, rifles and ammunition must be declared and registered at the police firearms office using the official **permit form (POL 573)**.

Import requirements:

- Sporting bolt-action or double rifles only (*Handguns, semi-automatic, and automatic firearms are not permitted*) - Minimum recommended caliber: **.300 Win Mag class**. Smaller calibers allowed only for selected species - own ammunition supplied.
- A maximum of **100 rounds of ammunition per rifle** is allowed, in the declared calibre only.
- Firearms and ammunition must be **transported in locked cases** separately, in compliance with airline regulations.
- **Proof of ownership** (such as U.S. Customs Form 4457).

Your outfitter will assist with the process, and permits are normally issued quickly upon arrival.



Clothing & Packing Recommendations:

- Comfortable, ankle-support hunting boots
- Hat for sun protection
- Warm jacket for cool mornings and evenings (especially June–August)
- Long trousers and long-sleeved shirts are recommended for thorny bushveld terrain
- Neutral colours only
- A **220–240V** voltage converter / transformer (if your device is not dual-voltage)
- A plug adapter compatible with **Type D** and **Type M**


