All resorts - Spring 2025

Once again, the EU has delayed the regulation timetable for the EES (the entry exit system for Non EU residents to enter to the EU). This is the eye scan and digital finger print. This has been delayed until October 2025.

The other system of entry into the EU, which is the ETAS system where you need to obtain a holiday type Visa costing 7 euros and last for 3 years, has been put back to October 2026.

Spain however is still going ahead with the Royal Decree 933/2021. This is where all providers or holiday accommodation have to register each visitor over the age of 14 with the Spanish Ministry of the Interior, through a system called SES Hospidajes. We have had to register with the Government and our Regulation Number is : REGA-GE25e00013092750.

Everyone staying in one of the company's apartments or villas has to complete 17 items of information about you that we need to send to the Ministry.

We have enclosed at the end of the Newsletter, a typical form for a Julimar Villa. These forms will be sent to you once you have completed your reservation request and the **MUST** be returned to us at least 3 weeks prior to your arrival at either La Parata or Julimar.

Spain, as you will have probably heard from the UK media, has suffered for 3-4 weeks of steady and prolonged rain and high winds during February and March.

Both Mojacar and Cala en Porter did not get extensive flooding however we did get rain into some of the properties. The La Parata office in Mojacar did get about 25mm of water over the office floor. All the gardens and countryside vegetation is now growing enormously but some winter works have been delayed and will not be completed until April/ May.

The Spanish Government has increased Electricity prices by changing the rate of IVA (VAT) that is now charged at a higher rate than before.
