Daniel C. Schreck joined the University on the feast of the Annunciation in 2024 as Chief Strategy Officer and inaugural Director of The Institute. He spent nearly two decades in and around New York City, including 14+ years as a partner at Equinox Partners, a hedge fund with a value-investing lineage tracing back to Warren Buffett. Earlier, he worked as an international marketing consultant for Sony Music and was the first director of young adult outreach for the Archdiocese of New York.

Daniel has held various roles in government and non-profits. He was a Presidential appointee in the first Trump administration and served in the representative town government of Greenwich, Connecticut. He has been on the boards of The Knights of Columbus Charitable Fund, Avail NYC, The Culture of Life Foundation, and The Catholic Artists Society. He currently serves as President and Chairman of the Jerome Lejeune Foundation USA.

He holds degrees from Franciscan University (BA, Biology), Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum (Licentiate, Bioethics), and Columbia Business School (MBA). His work has appeared in *The Wall Street Journal*, *Fox News*, and *The New Criterion*. A member of Legatus, Daniel and his wife Annie have nine children and split their time between Ave Maria and off-grid summers in New Hampshire.
