New Army Vice Chief of Staff

Gen. James J. Mingus has been sworn in as the 39th vice chief of staff of the Army. Mingus also received his fourth star during the swearing-in ceremony led by Army Chief of Staff Gen. Randy A. George.

Gen. Mingus most recently served as the director of the Joint Staff from 2022 to 2024 and is a former commander of the 82nd Airborne Division and he commanded the 4th Infantry Division's 4th Brigade Combat Team, leading it on a deployment to Afghanistan.

During that deployment, former Capt. Florent Groberg, who led Mingus' personal security detachment, earned the Medal of Honor for stopping a suicide bomber from attacking Mingus and other senior leaders who were attending a meeting with Afghan leaders. In September 2015, Mingus returned to Fort Carson and the 4th Infantry Division to serve as the division's deputy commanding general (maneuver).

He has commanded every echelon from company to division, and worked in key staff positions in Army, special operations, and joint units.

Gen. Mingus has deployed 12 times to Iraq and Afghanistan, and since January 5, 2024, serves as the Army's No. 2 general officer and is the principal deputy to Gen. George.

D-Day 80th Anniversary

The 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings along the Normandy coast during World War II, which ultimately led to the liberation of Europe, will be celebrated June 6, 2024. Special celebrations with World leaders are being planned throughout Europe and in the United States to mark the 80th anniversary of the invasion.

Nearly 160,000 Allied troops landed in Normandy on June 6, 1944. Of those, 73,000 were from the United States, 83,000 from Britain and Canada. Forces from several other countries were also involved, including French troops fighting with Gen. Charles de Gaulle against the

Nazi occupation. They faced around 50,000 German forces. In all, more than 2 million Allied soldiers, sailors, pilots, medics, and other people from a dozen countries were involved in the overall Operation Overlord.

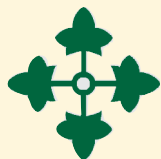

- Webmaster Rick Adams continues to exceed all expectations for our website with many enhancements submitted for review at our last annual reunion.

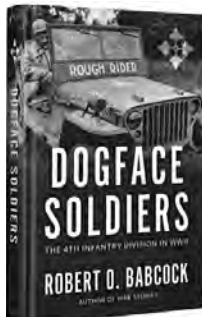

FROM THE HISTORIAN

New Book Announcement

Dogface Soldiers – The History of the 4th Infantry Division in WWII



From the first National 4th Infantry Division Association (4IDA) annual reunion I attended in 1991 until the early 2000s, I sat and listened to our WWII veterans for hours on end as they told their war stories from their fight across Europe in 1944-1945. When I became president of 4IDA in 1998 and appointed myself as historian (which I still am today), I challenged our dwindling number of WWII veterans to write down their war stories and send to me to put into a book.

In 2001, I published my first book of War Stories. In it are 325 stories from WWII vets, 50 from Cold War vets, and

100 from Vietnam vets. Today, most of our WWII veterans are no longer with us, but their stories live on.

As we approached the 75th anniversary of D-Day in 2019, I started digging through the 4ID WWII Daily After Action Reports that a WWII vet had copied many years ago from the National Archives. Every week that year from D-Day (6 June) to VE Day (May 8), I sent out a Facebook post covering the 4ID history from that week, along with war stories I had collected.

As we come up on the 80th anniversary of the 4ID's fight across Europe, it will likely be the last one with more than a few WWII vets still alive. Most Americans today know very little about what their parents, grandparents, and great grandparents did to save the world from the grasp of Adolph Hitler's attempt to dominate the world.

Thus, I have focused much of the past few years taking the history I have secured from many sources and putting

it together into a single, all-inclusive (over 500 pages) 4ID World War II book entitled *Dogface Soldiers: The History of the 4th Infantry Division in World War II*. Told from the daily after action reports, excerpts from books written by 4ID Soldiers and historians, personal stories written by 4ID veterans, pictures, and other sources, make this the all-inclusive history of the 4th Infantry Division in World War II – from June 1940 to March 1946.

Pre-sales of the book began on the www.deedspublishing.com bookstore on 15 February, with books to be available before 31 March 2024. Proceeds from the book will go into my work to publish several additional books of 4ID history and war stories from Vietnam through today's War on Terror. Steadfast & Loyal, Bob

The Ralph E Lingert Service Award Nominations

All nominations must be submitted to the Executive Director by April 15th.

The Ralph E. Lingert Service Award represents the highest award that can be given by the National 4th Infantry (IVY) Division Association. It is a lifetime achievement award named in honor of Past National President and Financial Secretary Ralph E. Lingert. It shall be presented annually to the National 4th Infantry (IVY) Division Association member who is deemed to have shown the type of devotion to duty and Steadfast and Loyal dedication to the National 4th Infantry (IVY) Division Association that was found to be synonymous with the name Ralph E. Lingert. The recipients will be announced, and the award presented at the National Reunion banquet each year.

Nominations

1. Any member of the Association in good standing may nominate a candidate.
2. Any Chapter (with the concurrence of the Chapter President) may nominate a candidate.
3. Nominations must be in writing outlining the candidate's outstanding accomplishments as to the development, perpetuation, and service to his/her Chapter and/or the National 4th Infantry (IVY) Division Association.
4. Each member and/or Chapter may only make one nomination per year.
5. Nominations must be mailed or E-mailed to the Executive Director, for review and selection by the Executive Board. All nominations must be **received by April 15th each year.**

Selections

The Executive Director will submit all valid nominations to the Executive Board for review. The Executive Board will select the recipient from the valid nominations received. Any member of the Executive Board whose name is placed in nomination shall exclude himself/herself from the entire selection process. Selection of the recipient must be made by June 1st each year, or a minimum of 30 days prior to the National Reunion (whichever is sooner).

Michael P. May, Esq. is the Honored Recipient of the 2023 Brigadier General Philip Sherman Award presented during the Annual Meeting of the Maryland State Bar Association's Veterans Affairs and Military Law Section.

Citation: On December 29, 1980; Michael Patrick May became a member of the Maryland State Bar. As a trial Attorney and Counselor at Law, Mike May has dedicated his time to preserving the legal rights and due process of Maryland's citizens. In this capacity, he has maintained a general law practice since February 1997. It has been stated that "Mr. May is an exceptional attorney. His ethics and honesty are above reproach. His knowledge of Maryland statutes and laws are rather amazing."

Of note, and representative of his passion for advocacy on behalf of veterans and service members, Mr. May military service included serving in the U.S. Army, as a Military Police Officer, Fourth Infantry Division, Vietnam, from August 1967 to September 1968 to include the awarding of the Army Commendation Medal. Continuing his dedication to public service, Mr. May served as Detective Police Sergeant from June 1970 until his disability retirement in the line of duty in August 1977. Ultimately, Mr. May obtained the rank of Colonel during his service as a member of the Maryland Defense Force from 2007 to 2015.

CITATION

"1st Sgt. McNerney distinguished himself when his unit was attacked by a North Vietnamese battalion near Polei Doc. Running through the hail of enemy fire to the area of heaviest contact; he was assisting in the development of a defensive perimeter when he encountered several enemy at close range. He killed the enemy but was painfully injured when blown from his feet by a grenade. In spite of this injury, he assaulted and destroyed an enemy machine-gun position that had pinned down five of his comrades beyond the defensive line. Upon learning his commander and artillery forward observer had been killed, he assumed command of the company. He adjusted artillery fire to within 20 meters of the position in a daring measure to repulse enemy assaults. When the smoke grenades used to mark the position were gone, he moved into a nearby clearing to designate the location to friendly aircraft. In spite of enemy fire, he remained exposed until he was certain the position was spotted and then climbed into a tree and tied the identification panel to its highest branches. Then he moved among his men readjusting their position, encouraging the defenders, and checking the wounded. As the hostile assaults slackened, he began clearing a helicopter landing site to evacuate the wounded. When explosives were needed to

remove large trees, he crawled outside the relative safety of his perimeter to collect demolition material from abandoned rucksacks. Moving through a fusillade of fire he returned with the explosives that were vital to the clearing of the landing zone. Disregarding the pain of his injury and refusing medical evacuation, 1st Sgt. McNerney remained with his unit until the next day when the new commander arrived. 1st Sgt. McNerney's outstanding heroism and leadership were inspirational to his comrades. His actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the U.S. Army and reflect great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of his country."

Chosen as the spearhead amphibious division of the D-Day landing on the Normandy coast of France, the men of the 4th Infantry Division stormed ashore at H-Hour (0630 hours) on a stretch of the French coast named - for this operation and forever after - Utah Beach. It was for his actions that day that Brigadier General Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., Assistant Division Commander, earned the first Medal of Honor of the division.

After their successful D-day landing, the men of the Ivy division fought through the hedgerows of the Cotentin Peninsula en route to taking the critically important

port of Cherbourg on June 25, 1944. The division was in continuous action during the period of June 6 to June 28 when the last resistance around Cherbourg was eliminated. During this period, the 4th Infantry Division sustained over 5,450 casualties and had over 800 men killed.

With hardly a pause to catch their breath, the Ivymen continued to attack through the hedgerow country and, along with the 2nd Armored Division, spearheaded the breakthrough at St. Lo on July 25, 1944. Exploiting the break in the German lines, the division continued the attack across France. On August 25, 1944

they, along with the French 2nd Armored Division, were the troops who earned the distinction of liberating Paris from four years of Nazi rule. Passing through the wildly applauding Parisians, the Ivymen left the victory parade to outfits following in their wake and continued to pursue the Germans.

On September 11, 1944, a patrol from the 4th Infantry Division became the first Allied ground force to enter Germany. Fighting in the Siegfried Line followed. Mid November found the division in the bloodiest battle of its history. The most grueling battle in Europe was fought in the Hurtgen Forest. Fighting in the cold rain and snow and in a forest of pine and fir trees 150 feet in height, the Ivymen slugged it out yard-by-yard and day-by-day against determined German artillery and infantry resistance. By early December, the division had fought through what had become a twisted mass of shrapnel-torn stumps and broken trees and had accomplished its mission. Casualties in the Hurtgen often exceeded 150 percent of the original strength of a rifle company.

With the Hurtgen Forest behind them, the division moved into a defensive position in Luxembourg and was soon engaged in the Battle of the Bulge. General George S. Patton wrote to Major General Raymond Barton of the 4th Infantry Division: “Your fight in the Hurtgen Forest was an epic of stark infantry combat; but, in my opinion, your most recent fight – from the 16th to the 26th of December – when, with a depleted and tired division, you halted the left shoulder of the German thrust into the American lines and saved the City of Luxembourg, and the tremendous supply establishments and road nets in that vicinity, is the most outstanding accomplish-

ment of yourself and your division.”

As the German push was halted in the Bulge, the Ivy Division resumed the attack and continued the pursuit through the Siegfried Line - the same location it had crossed in September - and fought across Germany as the war ground on in the first four months of 1945. When the war ended on May 8, 1945, the 4th Infantry Division had participated in all the campaigns from the Normandy Beach through Germany. Five more battle

streamers were added to the 4th Infantry Division colors and personnel of the Division during this period wear the five campaign stars of Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes, and Central Europe. The division suffered almost 22,000 battle casualties and over 34,000 total casualties, including over 5,000 who were killed or died of injuries, during their eleven months of fighting across Europe. For 199 straight days, the 4th Infantry Division was in constant contact with the Germans.

VA to ease benefits rules for vets exposed to Agent Orange in the US

Thousands of veterans exposed to Agent Orange while serving in the United States will for the first time be eligible for fast-track disability benefits under plans unveiled by the Department of Veterans Affairs on Friday.

The move represents another major expansion of toxic exposure benefits for veterans, this time for individuals suffering from illnesses dating back to the Vietnam War era. The changes follow mandates included in the Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act — better known as the PACT Act — passed by Congress in August 2022.

Over the last two years, a combination of administration moves and new legislation opened access to disability benefits for millions of veterans who incurred injuries from burn pit smoke, radiation contamination and other military toxic exposure events.

Get a Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)

A Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) is a photo ID card you'll use to check in at your VA health care appointments. Learn how to get a VHIC in person or online—and how to replace a lost or stolen card.

How do I get my VHIC?

First, you'll need to be enrolled in VA health care. If you're not already enrolled, you can apply now. <https://www.va.gov/health-care/how-to-apply/>

After you receive your VA health care welcome call, you can apply for a VHIC in person at a VA medical center or online. Note: Only request your card once, either in person or online. If you request your card more than once, it will cause a delay.

2024 Educational Scholarships

Two types of Educational Scholarships are available from the National 4th Infantry (IVY) Division Association Scholarship Trust: the E.R. Smith Memorial Scholarship and the Legacy Educational Scholarships (previously named Annual Educational Scholarships). By applying for Educational Scholarships, you agree to the terms and conditions of the Scholarship Trust. The number of scholarships and the dollar amount awarded each year will be determined by the committee based on the Scholarship Trust Fund balance. Applications for both types of Educational Scholarship may also be downloaded from the 4IDA Website.

E. R. Smith Memorial Scholarship - shall be awarded to the child, children, stepchildren or legally adopted child or

children of those soldiers of the Fourth Infantry Division who died while serving with the Fourth Infantry Division in Iraq, Afghanistan and/or the War against Terror since September 11, 2001. Membership in this Association is not a condition precedent for application for a Memorial Scholarship. Eligibility to receive a Memorial Scholarship ends at age twenty-five (25). Requests for Memorial Scholarships may be submitted at any time annually using the E. R. Smith Memorial Scholarship Application request form and attach documents that confirm your eligibility. The E.R. Smith Memorial Scholarship Application may be downloaded from the 4IDA Website's Scholarship page.

Legacy Educational Scholarships – Legacy Educational Scholarships shall be awarded based on Patriotic themed essays submitted by the applicants. The Scholarship Committee will use a blind judging process to select the top essays from all entries. Applications for Legacy Educational Scholarships must be emailed prior to the June 15th deadline each year using the current years' application form and attaching your Patriotic themed essay in 250-to-500-words in Microsoft Word format to the Scholarship Committee Secretary, Philip Menendez at pmenendez6@comcast.net. The current year's Legacy Educational Scholarship Applications may be downloaded from the 4IDA website Scholarship page or may be found in The Ivy Leaves.

The Patriotic theme for the 2024 Essay is: "What does patriotism mean to me?"

Legacy Educational Scholarships - a) A regular member of this Association in good standing may apply for a scholarship for his or her child, children or stepchildren, legally adopted child, or children and/or grandchild, grandchildren, or step-grandchildren. b.) To be eligible to receive a Legacy Educational Scholarship, applicants must be a high school graduate and enrolled full-time as an undergraduate student to an accredited college, university, or postsecondary vocational/technical schools within the United States. c.) Regular members submitting winning applications must provide written proof, from the applicable institution, of the student's acceptance or current enrollment to the Scholarship Committee secretary by December 15th of the year the scholarship was awarded. Failure to submit such written proof in timely fashion shall result in withdrawal of the scholarship. All Applications for Legacy Educational Scholarships must follow the Scholarship Committee's guidelines. Incomplete Legacy Educational Scholarship Applications will not be considered.

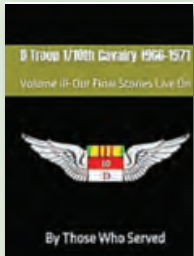

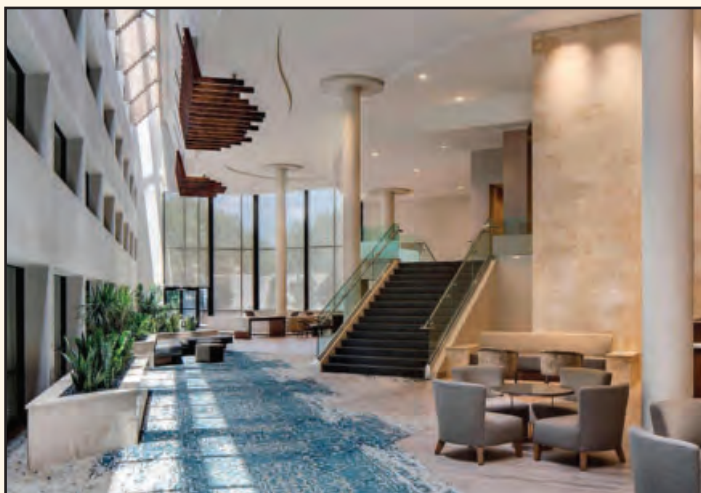

When the new website was launched in September 2023, we transferred the member records from the old site; anyone who was a member as of January 1, 2022 was imported into the new site database. When you come to the new website for the first time, you will need to reset your password with your email address. Your Login credentials from the old site will not allow access to the new site. You can also visit the FAQ page for more information and help. If you haven't reset your password yet, then hit the 'click here' at the top of the Login Page and follow the instructions.

Members are encouraged to login, set up their password, and use the features of the site. Expired members can Login, see their profile information, but will be denied access to the 'Members Only' portion of the site. We are anticipating these members will want to reinstate their member-

ship, so please take the time to go through each page of the website and become familiar with the content. Certainly, contact the webmaster if you encounter anything that needs correcting. Visit the website often; we will keep updates coming your way.

One of the features we wanted to incorporate into the new site is Auto-Renewing Memberships, as long term this will benefit dues collection and provide an added convenience to members and help the Executive Director with dues collection. It should be noted this will take some years to transition all our membership over to this more automated process as we have members expiring out through 2029.

One issue with the Auto-Renewing feature is that it only works for memberships on an annual basis. So, we will not be able offer the 3-Year memberships on the web-

At this time, all the imported Expiring Members will not be able to see their expiration dates in their profile until they have purchased a membership plan on the new site. Further, they will not get a notice from the website that will have to be done manually. To make that chore less burdensome for us, we will be sorting /assigning membership expiration dates by calendar quarters. This will allow us to send group renewal notices to only those expiring members as needed.

When a member's dues have expired, access to the gated 'Members Only' content will be denied. They will still be listed in the membership directory, however.

Members, who choose not to be listed in the online Membership Directory, can make that selection in their profile, and not be included in the member search field.

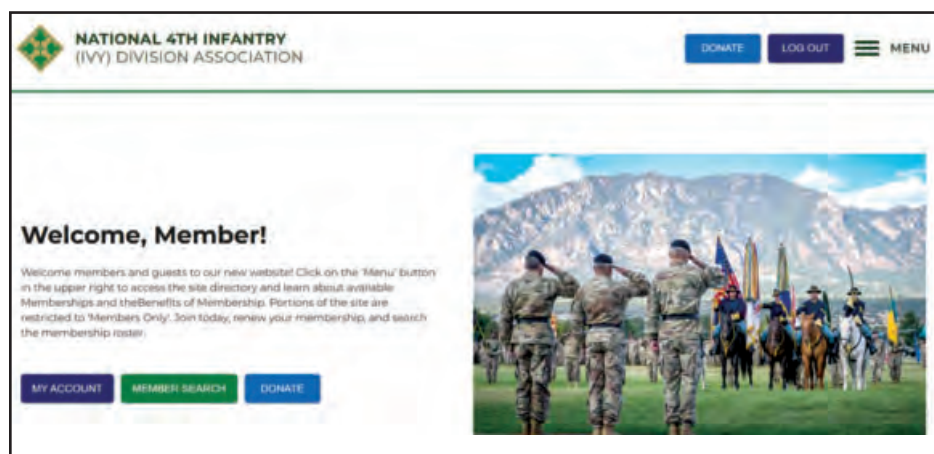
Since we will be using the Auto-Renewing feature for membership management, any donations made through the website will need to be done in a separate transaction. The membership options on the new website will be:

The 3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division, to Europe to replace the 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division, as part of a regular rotation of forces to support the United States' commitment to NATO allies and partners.

FORT CARSON, Colo. 02.02.2024—Service members know they could deploy, but not everyone gets the chance. For one new private first class, it is not only his first deployment but also his first time ever setting foot outside the U.S.

Pfc. Gage Borum, a quartermaster and chemical equipment repairer assigned to the 64th Brigade Support Battalion, 3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division, enlisted in the Army on Oct. 20, 2022, and serving the country is something he always wanted to do.

He says the Army was a good starting point to jump-start his career. He was always interested in the mechanical aspect of service, which led him down the path to becoming a quartermaster and chemical equipment repairer. After graduating from Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training, he arrived at his first duty station at Fort Carson.

Despite the nerves that come with doing something entirely new, Borum says he is ready to face this head-on and complete every task necessary to ensure the mission's success.

"We're making sure all our equipment is up and running, washed and ready to go," Borum said. "We're dealing with genera-

tors, wheeled and tracked equipment. We're doing proper preventive maintenance checks and services and ensuring everything is operable. We have to make sure they are ready for missions."

With the high stakes of deployment, many Soldiers can feel uneasy at the thought of having to leave. Most must go through classes and mentally prepare to be away from family and friends.

"You have to learn and adapt to any situation you're going through," said Staff Sgt. Dalton Mitchell, Borum's section leader, assigned to 64th BSB, 3rd ABCT, 4th Inf. Div. "The first time I ever went overseas, I was scared. For a lot of Soldiers, deployment is going to be a humongous shock. They have to be resilient but also have the leadership to back them up and support them."

However, Mitchell also says the Soldiers have much to look forward to and many new things to experience during a deployment. Although deployments typically only last nine months, the memories Soldiers make during them will last a lifetime.

"I'm a little nervous to enter a new country but excited for it," Borum said. "I'm hoping to get a lot of experience and a lot more knowledge. As far as expectations go, I expect the best of everything. It's the excitement of going on this deployment, it's all exciting, and it's all new."

Retired Soldier Council promotes SFL mindset

The Soldier for Life (SFL) mindset was the main focus of the Army Chief of Staff's Retired Soldier Council during their recent annual meeting at the Pentagon. The Council discussed the retired community's desires and concerns with 15 of the Department of Defense's senior leaders, including Acting Secretary of the Army Patrick J. Murphy, Army Chief of Staff Gen. Mark A. Milley, and Sgt. Maj. of the Army Daniel A. Dailey. The Council saw the Soldier for Life

mindset as the means to link members of the retired military community who still have a strong desire to serve with the Army's need to bridge the civil-military divide. Council members cited misunderstandings caused by a lack of personal interaction between civilians and military as the source of the civil-military divide. Members saw the divide widening as older veterans pass away and fewer Americans serve in the military or meet Service members during their daily lives.

The members of the Retired Soldier Council represent more than 950,000 Retired Soldiers and 243,000 surviving

spouses in the United States and 124 other countries. They are nominated by the Army installation or Army Service Component Command retiree councils on which they serve. The Council Co-Chairs select new members each year to fill vacancies on the 14-member Council. New members are approved by the CSA to serve four-year terms and are recalled to active duty annually for the Council's week-long meeting.

'Sense Of Urgency' Fuels Army Transformation

In addition to building a reliable, secure network, the Army must have a network that's mobile and agile. "When you're on the battlefield, you don't want to be seen, you want to blend into the environment," George said.

The Army must move with a sense of urgency as it contends with an increasingly volatile and complex world, Army Chief of Staff Gen. Randy George said.

"The difference today is the tech disruption we've had, the volatility is completely different, and just how fast things are spinning on the tech side," George said Feb. 6 during an Association of the U.S. Army Coffee Series event. "I think it's completely different from what we've seen, and there's a lot of implications with that and how we do business and how we change."

As he travels across the force, George said he's been able to see how soldiers are adapting to the challenges of missions around the world. "I've been really getting out there and talking to our troops," he said. "What we want to do is focus on our warfighting mission and building cohesive teams."

George said he also is focused on how the Army can "unencumber" commanders and soldiers, such as getting rid of excess equipment, so that they can focus on the important tasks.

"Warfighting, I always tell everybody that that has to be the focus," George said.

"I want leaders at every level to understand that's what we're focused on. If you're not relaying that message all the way down with what you're doing, then we need to recalibrate what we're doing."

As the Army prepares for the future fight, George said he's looking at lessons from the war in Ukraine and fighting in the Middle East. This means prioritizing the network and looking for ways to incorporate unmanned aerial systems, robotics, 3D printing and other emerging technologies to bolster the force.

It also means minimizing units' footprints—digital and physical—on the battlefield.

"The network has to be the No. 1 priority," George said. "You cannot communicate, you cannot command and control, everything we do across our warfighting functions depends on our network."

In addition to building a reliable, secure network, the Army must have a network that's mobile and agile. "When you're on the battlefield, you don't want to be seen, you want to blend into the environment," George said.

During a recent visit to the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, California,

George said he observed as the 1st Armored Division tactical command post was "five vehicles" protected by a radio frequency shield and a small unmanned aerial system, and a command-and-control node "that could be moved in five minutes." The III Corps command post was hidden in a warehouse with no vehicles parked outside.

"That's what we need," George said. "It was very low signature."

To further experiment with reducing a unit's digital footprint while maximizing technologies such as robotics and unmanned aerial systems, the Army is selecting a number of brigades for what George calls "transforming in contact."

The goal is to adjust these formations for what the mission may demand. As an example, George said, a unit may get more unmanned aerial systems and electronic warfare capabilities. Another may get more robotics or the first batch of Next-Generation Squad Weapons. They will then train with these new capabilities and provide feedback on what's working and what's not.

"It's a really busy Army. We have to make some adjustments," George said. "There's a sense of urgency to what we're doing."

As the Army moves forward with its transformation, George said he tells leaders that everybody has a job to do at every level, and the service must do everything it can to make sure soldiers have the right leaders, equipment and training they need when they go into harm's way. "We can't forget that, regardless of how far you get from the front line, that's our mission, and we need to keep that at the forefront," he said.
