This year we will keep you updated about attendance of students and the goals we are setting. Working with our new 'Attendance Management plan' the first step is to strengthen communication between school and home should any student be away from school. If for any reason your child is away, please ring or email the school and let us know the reason for the absence as we must record this. With no communication we will mark your child as Truant. If we do not hear from you we will be contacting you to find out why and ensure that your child is safe.

Note the table below that the Ministry of Education has set as benchmarks: Four **Student Attendance Categories** have been developed to help schools understand how frequently each student attends. These categories give you a way to monitor the progress you are making in supporting students to attend regularly.

Regular attendance

Over 90% attendance - missing fewer than 5 days across a term.

Irregular absence

More than 80% and up to 90% attendance - absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term.

Moderate absence

More than 70% and up to 80% attendance - absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term.

Chronic absence

70% attendance or less - absent for 15 days or more across a school term.

Our goal for this Term is to have **84%** or above attending over 90% of the time this term. It is an aspirational goal but we have started the term really well and we are an amazing school – so let's give it a go!

Finally, as parents we ask that you continue to monitor that your children come with the correct uniform each day. Our students are looking fantastic, and we want to uphold the good look taking pride in our identity and to not let our standards slip. Kia kaha whanau!
