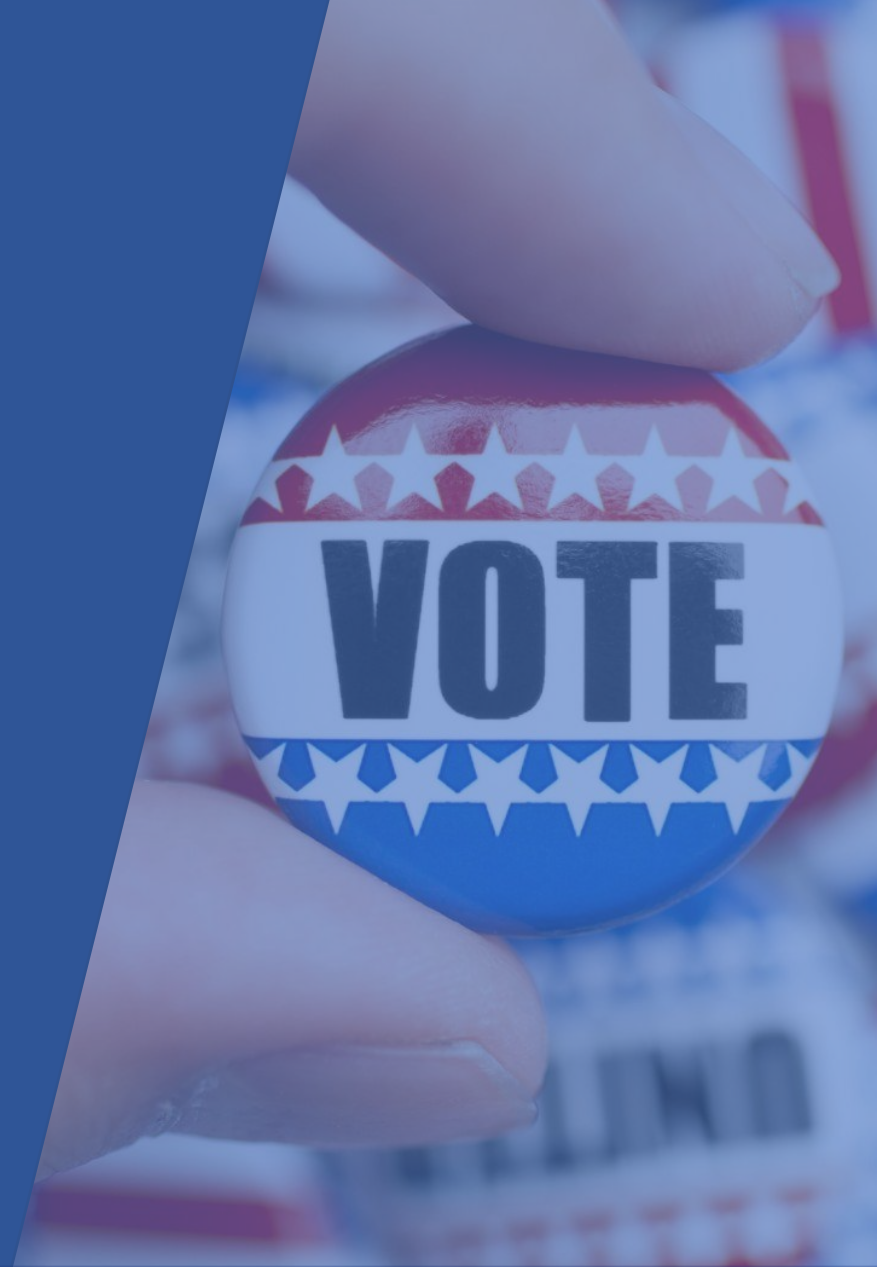

Audit Reveals Evidence of Voter Fraud in California's 2022 Election

California Receives Failing Grades on the Election Integrity Scorecard and Reflects "Worst Election Practices" in Nation

June 7, 2023

The audit conducted by our investigators shows that 14.17% of audited “uncured” ballots rejected for a missing or an invalid signature during the 2022 California November Election were likely fraudulently cast – as the voters for those ballots vehemently denied ever voting in the election.

Confirmed Attempt to Vote	81.7%
Denied They Voted	14.17%
Unsure of Whether They Voted	4.12%

Completed survey sample size = 388

Major Problems with California Elections

Major Problems with California Elections

1. Lack of Eligibility Verification

- California Secretary of State regulations and Motor Voter Law provide inadequate verification check on eligibility of registrations

2. Outdated Voter Registration Lists

- 2 million people fled California between 2019 and 2022
- California Secretary of State regulations tie the hands of county Registrar of Voters in maintaining accurate voter rolls

3. All Mail-in Ballot Elections Create Millions of "Orphan Ballots"

- People receiving ballots for other/unknown people
- Eliminates chain-of-custody on ballots

Major Problems with California Elections

4. Ballot Harvesting Schemes

- Political groups targeting swing districts to harvest ballots with or without voter knowledge

5. Failure to Check Signatures

- California Secretary of State regulations tie the hands of county Registrar of Voters in rejecting signatures that don't match

6. Post-Election Audits Inadequate to Answer Public's Concerns

- "Risk-limiting audits" only address a handful of issues of concern
- Proper audit should examine all the issues above with an independent board to oversee

Californians ARE Concerned About Voter Fraud

UC Berkeley/IGS Poll (Nov 2022)

"People voting or casting ballots illegally in elections"

- Major Threat: 39% (25% Democrats; 69% Republicans; 37% Independents)
- Minor Threat: 21% (20% Democrats; 21% Republicans; 22% Independents)
- Not a Threat: 35% (50% Democrats; 6% Republicans; 33% Independents)

Californians Don't Want to Make Voting Harder

UC Berkeley/IGS Poll (Nov 2022)

"Organized Efforts Making It Harder for Americans to Vote in Elections"

- Major Threat: 63% (79% Democrats; 32% Republicans; 61% Independents)
- Minor Threat: 15% (12% Democrats; 20% Republicans; 16% Independents)
- Not a Threat: 17% (5% Democrats; 42% Republicans; 15% Independents)

Americans from All Ideologies Support Voter ID

Rasmussen Poll (March 2021)

"Support for voter ID laws has actually [increased since 2018](#), when 67% said voters should be required to show photo identification such as a driver's license before being allowed to vote.

Eighty-nine percent (89%) of Republicans support voter ID requirements, as do 60% of Democrats and 77% of voters not affiliated with either major party."

Issues We Must Consider

1. How to Fix the Problems – We MUST Restore Election Integrity

- We need to prioritize reforms that have the biggest immediate impact on actually fixing the documented problems.

2. We Must Comply with Federal Voting Laws

- Help Americans Vote Act (HAVA) and National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) impose specific legal requirements that we must accommodate

3. What Will the Public Support?

- We cannot move beyond where public support is

4. Campaign Bandwidth

- Making sure we have sufficient volunteer and financial resources to succeed!

California Voter ID / Election Integrity Initiative

1. Holds California State and Local Officials Accountable for Accurate Voter List Maintenance

- Automatic mailing of ballots suspended for any voter whose residency is in doubt

2. Requires Voter ID Verification

- In-Person Voting: Driver's license or other government ID
- Vote-by-Mail: Driver's license AND signature match on ballot

3. Transparency on Polling Locations

- Requires reporting on wait times in each county for polling locations on Election Day – and expansion of polling options where problems exist

California Voter ID / Election Integrity Initiative

Section 3. Section 21 is added to Article II of the California Constitution as follows:

Section 21.

- For each election an individual may vote in that election only if the individual is a qualified elector and:
 - For in-person voting, the individual presents a valid and current Driver's License or other government-issued identification card, or
 - For voting-by-mail, the individual provides a signature that matches the signature on-file with their voter registration – and the individual provides the last 3 digits of a valid and current Driver's License or provides other government-issued proof of their identity.

Any individual who does not provide verification of their identity and eligibility to vote as defined in this section shall be given until two days prior to certification of that election to provide identity verification in order for their ballot to be counted.

California Voter ID / Election Integrity Initiative

- Consistent with federal law, each county shall have the duty and authority to maintain an accurate list of individuals registered to vote and shall implement a process to verify that each individual on their list is a qualified elector.
- If a county obtains information that suggests an individual no longer resides at the address given on their voter registration on file, no vote-by-mail ballot shall be automatically mailed to that individual unless the voter verifies their address or specifically requests a vote-by-mail ballot for a given election.

California Voter ID / Election Integrity Initiative

- Each county shall complete an evaluation of wait-times for voting in person in each election and report the results publicly along with actions it will take, consistent with federal law, to address any unreasonably long wait times identified in any polling location or voting center.
- All state and local government officials shall assist with and facilitate compliance with this section. A citizen may seek judicial review of the state or any county's performance in ensuring compliance with these requirements and a court may require the state or any county to take actions to improve full compliance with this section.

Viability Metric 1: Get Enough Online Petition Signatures

- Current Status: 88,124 currently of 150,000 goal
- Online petition is CRUCIAL because it becomes the "house list" for initial wave of signatures using our direct mailer program.

Viability Metric 2: Recruit Enough Volunteer Signature Collectors

- Current Status: 72,910 currently of 250,000 goal
- We need enough volunteers to sign up and make FIRM commitments for the number of signatures they can guarantee they will collect. Volunteers are asked to make commitments ranging from 10-25 signatures on the low end to 250+ signatures on the high end.

Viability Metric 3: Raise Enough Starting Phase Resources

- Current Status: \$221k currently of \$1M goal (\$3M for entire campaign)
- We need campaign funding to cover hard costs of printing petitions and signs, mailing out individual petitions and volunteer kits, and hiring canvassers for paid signature drives

Timeline to Qualify the CA Voter ID Initiative in 2024 (or 2026)

We will not start wet signature phase unless we know we will qualify on the first shot!

1. Filing Initiative – and Title and Summary

- We filed the Initiative in August 2023 and received Title and Summary on October 19, 2023. The 180-day clock started on October 19 and runs through early April 2024.

2. 2024 Signature Initiation: November 18 for December 1 Launch

- We would need to hit our 3 viability metric goals by November 18 for a full signature drive launch by December 1. That would give us 138 days to qualify.

3. 2026 Signature Initiation

- Build up the online petition, volunteer commitments, and funding to target levels from November 18 to March 1, 2024.
- Re-file the initiative March 15 to launch signature drive by May 15, 2024
- Collect signatures during the 2024 General Election (May 15 to November 15, 2024)

"Secure the Vote" California 2024



- Promote the S.A.F.E. Method of Voting
- SAFE Vote Sunday events (First Sunday of the month)
- Encourage EARLY Voting either
 - By mail in the first week with verification on "Track-My-Ballot"
 - In person at a polling center the Friday, Saturday, or Sunday before Election Day
- Recruit **Trusted** Workers for County Election Offices – and Train Them!

County "Audit the Vote" Ordinances

1. Review of Voter Rolls to Determine Accuracy

- This will be required at least 90 days prior to the election

2. Random Audit of Vote-by-Mail Ballot Signatures

- Random sample of ballots that were accepted to make sure no signatures were accepted that should have been rejected
- 100% review of ballots that were rejected to determine whether voter fraud occurred

3. Review Wait Times and Proposed Improvements

- Calculate wait times at polling centers on election day (particularly during the last 3 hours of voting) and identify ways to make voting easier for the following election
