1. Attend Job Fairs:

2. Network online and in person:

These experiences can also bolster your resume, especially if you don't have a lot of work experience. Attending online workshops and webinars in the industries that you are interested in working can help you meet and connect with people in those industries and give you a good indication of what their expectations are before you apply.

3. Informational interviews and the hidden job market:

Make an appointment to visit a company or person in the industry that you are interested in working for. This is a good opportunity to find out about the job's roles and responsibilities and whether there will be any job openings. Walk-ins and handing out your tailored resumes to relevant companies is another way to discover any hidden jobs which may not have been advertised publicly.
