Clinical Chemistry and Hematology

The Department of Clinical Chemistry and Hematology (KCH) performs laboratory research in blood and other bodily fluids on behalf of general practitioners, medical specialists (inside and outside the hospital), as well as other healthcare institutions such as medical examiners, general practitioners laboratories, veterinarians, companies and inspections (for example: "workplace drug tests").

Microbiology Test

Department of Microbiology consists of the section of Infection serology and section Bacteriology, Parasitology & Mycology. The department of Microbiology is responsible for the detection of infectious diseases (bacteriology, virology, serology, mycology and parasitology) and has a very important role in the infection prevention and control for the hospital and for the public health in general.

The LABHOH Medical Microbiology laboratory (registration number M321) has achieved the ISO standard 15189. This accreditation confirms that the laboratory works according to the international ISO standard, which indicates that the laboratory diagnostics are of good quality, are performed professionally and are focused on improvement.

Pathology Test

The department of pathology is the department in which, by means of a microscope, a diagnosis is made on material obtained from a patient.

There are 3 sub divisions in the department:

Histology where tissue is prepared and stained so that it can be seen through the microscope
Cytology where individual cells are prepared and stained so they can be seen through the microscope.
Immunohistochemistry where the identification of antigenic determinants of specific substances (proteins) by the application of antibodies to histological sections.

How to prepare for your visit

In order to get blood tested, patients must bring their AZV card along with the laboratory request form signed and stamped by a registered physician. When a patient does not have an AZV card, a patient must bring a valid identification.

How to prepare for your test

In order to do a laboratory test, you have received a laboratory request form signed by a registered physician. This will often be blood and/or urine tests, but you can also go to the laboratory to hand in faeces, semen or other body materials to be examined. For most tests you can go to all LABHOH locations an appointment is not necessary.

Read the laboratory request form that you received from your doctor, you can find instructions that are important for you. For example, whether you should be fasting for the test. Fasting means that you cannot eat or drink anymore on the day before the examination from 22:00. It is allowed to drink water or tea without additives. If you use medication you can take it as usual, unless your doctor has agreed otherwise.

For the test mentioned below you have to be on an empty stomach in order to get your tests done.

- Glucose
- GTT
- Dagcurve
- Triglycerides
