2026 Legislative Scorecard

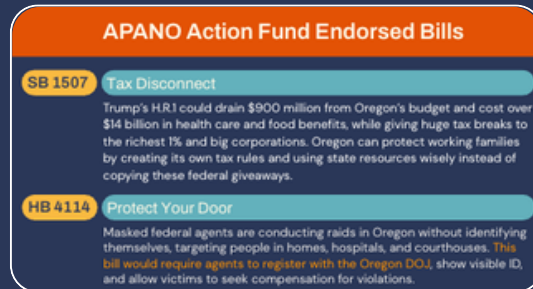
What is a Legislative Scorecard?

A scorecard is an accountability tool used to track how your representatives are voting. Think of it like a **report card for legislators**. It lets us see who's standing up for your community – and who might not be.

Note: this is a great tool to use during election season!

How to use this scorecard

1. Find out who represents your district below:
2. Check out our endorsed bills on pages 9 & 10.



3. Use the guide below to understand what each symbol represents:

- ✓ "Yes" Floor Vote
- Y "Yes" Committee Vote
- ✓ "Yes" Vote on opposed bill
- ✗ "No" Floor Vote
- N "No" Committee Vote
- ✗ "No" Vote on opposed bill
- EX Excused Absence

The total score reflects how well your elected officials voted this session on APANO Action Fund's priorities

HB 4125 Revenue Forecast Modernization Act

Oregon's kicker law often sends billions back in tax rebates — mostly to the wealthiest households — even as schools, health care, and other essential services face funding gaps. This bill would support more responsible budgeting to stabilize core services while still honoring the kicker law.

HB 4143 Recourse Act

This bill allows Oregon to withhold payments to the federal government if the federal government unlawfully withholds money owed to the state, even after a court order. It also protects state employees who follow the law and sets up a holding account until the federal government pays what it owes our state.

SB 1581 School Meals for All

This bill would make breakfast and lunch free for all Oregon public school students, regardless of income, starting in 2026. It removes stigmas and barriers to access while supporting health, learning, and well-being.

SB 1574 Vote 17

This proposal would allow 17-year-olds who will be 18 by the general election to vote in primary elections, giving them a say in choosing the candidates they'll ultimately vote for. It's a simple step toward fairer, more inclusive elections.

HB 4057 ODHS Referral for Families on Programs

This bill requires the Oregon Department of Human Services to proactively share information about early learning programs with families they serve. It ensures families don't miss out on critical early education opportunities simply because they weren't told.

SB 1546 AI Chatbots

This bill requires AI companions to clearly tell users they are interacting with software, and to have safeguards that detect and prevent content that could lead to suicide or self-harm. It adds extra protections for minors, requires annual reporting to the Oregon Health Authority, and allows users to sue if harmed by violations.

Oppose:

HB 4102 Outsourcing Pollution Permitting

A proposed bill backed by big tech companies like Intel and Amazon would privatize the DEQ permitting process, risking the loss of critical protections for communities. Without strong safeguards, it would weaken environmental oversight and benefit major polluters at the expense of public health.

APANO Action Fund Endorsed Bills

SB 1507 Tax Disconnect

Trump's H.R.1 could drain \$900 million from Oregon's budget and cost over \$14 billion in health care and food benefits, while giving huge tax breaks to the richest 1% and big corporations. Oregon can protect working families by creating its own tax rules and using state resources wisely instead of copying these federal giveaways.

HB 4114 Protect Your Door

Masked federal agents are conducting raids in Oregon without identifying themselves, targeting people in homes, hospitals, and courthouses. **This bill would require agents to register with the Oregon DOJ**, show visible ID, and allow victims to seek compensation for violations.

HB 4111 Anti-Discrimination on Immigration Status

This bill protects immigrant workers by **stopping employer retaliation and strengthening anti-profiling laws**. It also prevents immigration status from being used to intimidate or disadvantage people in civil cases like family court, wage theft, or discrimination.

SB 1541 Make Polluters Pay

This bill **strengthens officer identification rules, limits law enforcement masking**, and increases transparency in federal-state cooperation. It also protects free speech and civil rights by restricting surveillance based on protected activities and allows people harmed by violations to seek legal remedies.

HB 4138 LEVA (Law Enforcement Visibility Act) Bill

This bill would require the largest fossil fuel companies to help fund wildfire prevention, climate resilience, and protections for frontline communities instead of leaving taxpayers to cover the costs.

SB 1582 Virtual Power Plants

A Virtual Power Plant connects customer-owned energy tools like batteries, solar panels, and electric vehicles to support the power grid. It helps prevent blackouts and lower electricity bills by reducing peak demand and avoiding costly new power plants.
