1 Project Overview

The Digi Ready project runs from 01.11.2025 to 30.04.2027. The primary goals and target groups of our project center on empowering vulnerable adults, including seniors, migrants, refugees and the unemployed. To achieve this, we aim to strengthen their digital skills through practical workshops.



2 What Are We Planning

We will upskill adult-education trainers with practical AI tools, enabling them to create tailored learning paths to better support these learners. The project will produce 2 rounds of national workshops, 7 multilingual digital

3 Kick-off Meeting in Berlin

To officially launch the project, the consortium members gathered for a Kick-Off Meeting on December 2nd, 2025. The event was hosted by the iberika education group gGmbH. Partners focused on setting the stage for collaboration, presenting project goals, and establishing communication channels and management structures. The team discussed the plan for all activities, including coordination meetings, risk assessment strategies and planning for the upcoming workshops and tutorials.



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Recent Milestone: National Workshops & Needs Analysis

A major recent milestone for the project was the completion of our first round of National Workshops, led by our partner TEST (Transilvanian Educational Services & Tourism). These workshops were designed to address digital challenges directly with our learners:

- **Participation:** Each country hosted 15–25 vulnerable adults, ensuring a minimum of 60 participants across the partnership.
- **Environment:** The sessions successfully created a safe, supportive peer-learning setting where participants were able to talk openly about the digital barriers they face.

- **Questionnaires and Feedback:** The main focus was to gather important data through questionnaires. Participants identified the digital tasks they found most difficult and the real-life "digital situations" they want to master (such as sending messages, using maps or accessing online public services).
- **Outcomes:** The insights are currently being compiled into a needs summary. This will highlight the most urgent topics and recommended formats, which will inform the creation of our 7 upcoming digital tutorials.
