Nitten Develops a Sustainable Agricultural Tool The World's First Switch-Type Decomposable Paperpot®

Nippon Beet Sugar Manufacturing Co., Ltd. (Headquarters: Mita, Minato-ku, Tokyo; President: Shu Ishikuri; hereinafter referred to as "Nitten") has developed a new type of paperpot. The pot maintains its strength while raising seedlings, but its decomposition accelerates in the soil after transplanting. Nitten aims to expand the use of the pot in organic farming in various countries.

Paperpots, developed by Nitten, are paper containers for raising seedlings. These paper-based products are used for a variety of crops. They are designed to be durable for efficient transplanting, which makes them difficult to decompose in the soil after transplanting.

This time, Nitten developed a paperpot® made of paper cross-linked with citric acid that maintains high durability during the process of raising seedlings and, when alkaline treatment is performed beforehand, decomposition is promoted in the soil after transplanting. This is the world's first switch-type decomposition behavior. This new technology achieves both durability and decomposability, which was difficult with conventional paper materials.

Additionally, Nitten is aiming to eliminate plastic and comply with organic farming standards in various countries by changing the base paper to one that does not contain chemical fibers and by replacing the chemicals used to prevent paper decomposition with natural materials.
