# WORKING AT WYKE

Wyke is a successful and highly ambitious Sixth Form College whose aim is to be the best college in the country. We are an established, popular College with an outstanding reputation in the locality. The college draws students from Kingston-Upon-Hull, East Riding of Yorkshire, and further afield. The largest and one of the most successful A-level provider in the area, we offer applicants the opportunity to work alongside committed colleagues who have enabled our students to achieve high levels of success. At Wyke we put the student first and all decisions centre around staff working together to meet their best interests.

We currently have over 2400 students and around 200 members of staff. We offer a wide range of A Level courses as well as some highly successful VOC courses, both those equivalent to one, two and three A-levels, and a small number of GCSEs.

Each A-level, GCSE or VOC is allocated 4 x 70 minute lessons and a full time teacher will teach 5 of these 'blocks'. The teaching day begins at 9a.m. and finishes at 4p.m. On some mornings full staff or faculty briefings are held at 8.45a.m. to keep staff up to date with what is happening around the college and allow a time for them to catch up with each other.

We have an excellent team of staff and their continuing professional development is a priority at Wyke. The approach for this was recently revised so that so that members of staff fall into one of a number of development strands e.g. 'Aspiring Leaders', 'Lead Learners', 'Pastoral', 'Administrative'. Some development activities take place on one of the four Development Days spread across the year while other sessions are during afternoon workshops or independent activity which happens whenever is convenient for the staff members involved. Our plan is that every member of staff will have an entitlement to a significant amount of development every year and we also offer a system for people to log that development, including any activities undertaken independently.

We offer a welcoming college with supportive management and a strong team atmosphere as well as a modern environment. We are lucky to work with great students who are here to learn and have chosen their subjects so standards of behaviour are high.

# THE PE & SPORT DEPARTMENT AT WYKE SIXTH FORM COLLEGE

The department is lead by a Head of Subject alongside a Deputy Head of Subject, and is supported by a range of full-time, part-time and coaching staff. The academic courses on offer in the department in September will include:

- A-level PE (OCR)
- CTEC Sport Extended Certificate (Single)
- CTEC Sport Diploma (Double)
- CTEC Sport Extended Diploma (Triple)

This is a thriving department who won the National FE Teaching Team of the Year in 2019. They are extremely successful with many years of outstanding academic results, and growing rapidly—particularly with the introduction of the new Diploma course in September 2023. Facilities on site consist of a state of the art sports hall, a dance/fitness performance studio, outdoor hard court area and extensive playing fields. The college use a wide variety of local facilities, most notably local state of the art gyms. We also use the facilities of our neighbouring 11-16 school, including their sports hall, 3G pitch and MUGA and have strong links with Hull University to support both curriculum and extra-curricular activities.

The department offers a broad range of extra-curricular activities, some of which is as follows:

- Level 2 and 3 Personal Trainer course alongside their current studies. This is a standalone qualification that supports students to progress into the fitness industry. It is delivered onsite weekly facilitated by the external agency Sportsability, alongside a range of offsite sessions and assessments. Students can engage in this qualification at a much reduced rate compared to purchasing and completing outside of their college programme.
- Pre-physiotherapy programme which supports students to explore the different progression pathways into this industry beyond college and offers a bespoke support programme to successfully guide and support students into these specialist pathways over 2 years worth of workshops, university visits, mock interviews, personal statement support, etc. As part of this programme, students have the opportunity to engage in a range of additional qualifications to support their progression such as Rock Tape, massage workshops, etc.
- Representative sports teams which train and compete in two sessions over the academic week. Current teams that compete regularly are Men's Football (five teams), Ladies Netball (five teams), Rugby League and Union, Girls' Football (two teams), Men's Basketball, (two teams), Badminton, Cricket and Golf. This is alongside regional and national representative opportunities in a much wider range of sports. All of these teams compete in the AOC competitions
- Current recreational clubs/activities including activities such as yoga, table tennis, badminton, Girls Rugby League, fitness classes, to name but a few.
- Level 3 Sports Leaders Award which again provides an additional qualification and UCAS points for students to achieve alongside their studies.
- A range of external links to provide student workshops, experiences and employability sessions and talks across all disciplines; both built into the curriculum schemes of work as well as sessions outside of timetabled hours
