Update on progress since our last forum

- An increase in traffic enforcement visits to local streets, resulting in several penalty charge notices being issued.
- Following residential concerns over a particular car speeding around the local streets and the drivers poor driving generally, we were able to identify the driver leading to several positive actions:
 - The police were informed and spoke to the student about the manner of his driving
 - He was suspended from college and a disciplinary meeting was held with his father in attendance
 - He received a final written warning, and his general conduct will be monitored
- Due to an increase in student parking between Easter and May the College Leadership Team have been more visible in a morning, as students arrive to college, and during the day monitoring the parking situation.
- Continued regular litter picking around residential areas, by groups of students and daily litter picking by the college estates team.
- We have increased the number of bins which are situated near the Grammer School road entrance, in a bid to reduce litter.
- Students have engaged with tree counting with Councilors North and Hoffman.





Update on progress since our last forum

- Following resident's feedback four extremely large Poplar trees were removed by Access Tree Care.
- This has improved light into the respective properties, reduce the risk of tree debris falling into gardens and the tree roots continuing to cause extensive damage to gardens and eventually properties.
- We will also be planting a laural hedge to provide privacy and security.





Update on progress since our last forum

Following a visit by The Yorkshire Wildlife Trust , we have identified a couple of projects to increase ecosystem diversity around the campus, these projects include:

- Adding several swift boxes across the site. These birds bring a range of positive ecosystem benefits, such as controlling populations of insects and thankfully they do not cause any mess.
- The swift boxes will be fitted to the eaves of the college buildings.
- We are also looking at the installation of bat boxes, which also bring positive ecosystem benefits.
- An increase in shrub and small tree planting across the site, to increase diversity and improve the ecosystem, helping towards controlling carbon emissions.





Update on progress since our last forum – Councillor Hofman

Plans to create off street parking:

- The council has agreed to bring forward the garage demolition programme for Cropton Road
- This will create up to 60 additional parking spaces
- The demolition of the garages will commence in July/August
- New parking area will be ready to use by the end of September.
