- Work with external agencies as appropriate. Examples include ensuring we meet the Disability Confident Employer standards, working towards White Ribbon (anti-violence against women and girls) accreditation, working with Matthew's Hub to support neurodiverse students.

Progress is reviewed each year using staff and student feedback, training records, and policy review. General equality training for staff and governors is kept up to date and extended training on specific topics is provided as needed and in line with our current overarching equality aims.
