

## Post-Examination Services

### Enquiries about Results (EAR) Review of Results (ROR) and Access to Scripts (ATS)

If after collecting your AS, A-Level, GCSE, L3 Technical and Vocational results you find you want to access one of the services available you will need to do this through the college. Awarding bodies will only accept requests from centres and not from candidates or their parents.

#### Permission from Candidates

Enquires about results may result in candidates' marks and/or grades being confirmed, raised or lowered. Consequently, **candidates must give their consent in writing for a clerical check or review. Candidates' consent is also required for access to scripts.** Please discuss with your teacher/tutor and use the appropriate form for the service you require. Forms will be available from the exams team on results day and via a link on the website.

#### Review of Results

A review of results *involves a review of the original marking to ensure the mark scheme has been applied correctly.* The script is not remarked from scratch. Scripts are only fully remarked if the exam board decides that a particular marker keeps getting things wrong.

There are three possible outcomes:

- Your original mark is lowered, so your final grade may be lower than the original grade you received.
- Your original mark is confirmed as correct, so there is no change to your grade.
- Your original mark is raised, so your final grade may be higher than the original grade you received.

Priority Review of Results – The deadline for this is **19th August 2026**. Awarding bodies will process the request within a maximum of 15 calendar days of the application. Candidates are strongly advised to inform their university that a review has been requested. Awarding bodies will not inform UCAS of a review but will advise them if a grade change is made.

Non-priority – all other requests are processed as non-priority. The deadline is **24<sup>th</sup> September 2026**.

Please note, In the grading of A level Visual Arts, Fine Art, Graphic Design and Photography, there is no immediate access to a review, even if you find your award to be three marks or less from the next grade boundary. This is because via formal exam board procedure, marks have already been externally accessed to within three marks of accuracy by moderators in June.

#### **Clerical re-check**

Exam boards re-check that all marks have been included and added up correctly. This *involves a check that all parts of the script have been marked and checks the totalling and recording of marks.* Awarding bodies will process the request within 10 calendar days of the application. The deadline for this is **24<sup>th</sup> September 2026**.

#### Payment

Where a candidate is **within three 3 marks** of an *overall* grade boundary, the college will cover the cost of a review for one component/paper to be reviewed. For all other requests students are required to pay. All payments are collected through Parent Pay. Evidence of payment will need to be seen before the application can be processed. Cost of each service can be found at the back of this document.

Any fees paid are refunded if the overall grade is raised. If fees have been paid by students, then they will be refunded back through Parent Pay.

### **Access to Scripts**

You may want to request a copy of your script so you can discuss with your teacher or tutor if a review or clerical check would be appropriate. The deadline to request scripts is **22nd September 2026**. Scripts can be requested by candidates for personal use or by teachers to support teaching and learning with other students. In both cases scripts cannot be requested without candidate consent, please ensure the relevant boxes are ticked on the consent form. Some costs may be incurred if scripts are required post review.

### **Reviews of Moderation**

This is a review of the original moderation to ensure that the assessment criteria have been fairly, reliably, and consistently applied. It is not a re-moderation of candidates work. Reviews of moderation can only be applied to groups and not individuals. The college will let you know if we request a review of moderation.

### **Appeals**

If a centre thinks an awarding body has made an error on a review of results or moderation, or not applied its procedures consistently, properly or fairly, then it may be possible to submit an appeal. An appeal can only be made by the Head of Centre against:

- Results – after a review of results has taken place.
- Malpractice decisions.
- Decisions against access arrangements or special consideration.

Please contact the exams team if you require further information or think you may need to appeal.

### **Outcomes from Services**

If you request a service, you will be emailed with the outcome to your college and personal email address. Your college email address and Teams will only be available until **31<sup>st</sup> of August 2026**. After this date you will be contacted through the personal email address we hold on the system.

### **Sending requests electronically after results day or contacting us**
