

# Privacy Policy for FrikirkeNet

## Data responsibility

We take your data protection seriously. We process personal data and have therefore adopted this privacy policy, which tells you how we process your data.

The City Church is the data controller, and we ensure that your personal data is processed in accordance with the law.

## Processing of personal data

### We ensure fair and transparent data processing

When we ask you to provide us with your personal data, we will inform you of what data we process about you and for what purpose. You will receive this information at the time of collection of your personal data.

### We use this type of data about you

We use data about you to improve our service and ensure quality in our products and services as well as in our contact with you.

In general, we collect six types of data: 1. Data about volunteers 2.

Data about participants in FrikirkeNet's events

3. Data about financial contributors (partners, MobilePay donors, etc.)

4. Employee data

### We collect and store your personal data for specific purposes.

Re 1, 2, 3 and 4: We collect your name, address, telephone number and email address. The purpose is to administer the relationship with us to which you have given consent.

Re 3: For financial contributors who have indicated that they want a tax deduction for their contribution, we also store the social security number for use in our reporting to the Danish Tax Authorities.

Re 4: We store the social security number for use in the statutory reporting to the Danish Tax Authorities.

### We only process relevant personal data

We only process data about you that is relevant and sufficient in relation to the purposes defined above. The purpose is decisive for what type of data about you is relevant to us. The same applies to the scope of the personal data we use. For example, we do not use more data than we need for the specific purpose.

### We only process necessary personal data.

We only collect, process and store the personal data that is necessary to fulfill our stated purposes. In addition, the type of data that is necessary to collect and store for our business operations may be determined by law –

this applies, for example, to membership lists. The type and scope of the personal data we process may also be necessary to fulfill a contract or other legal obligation –

This applies, for example, to declarations of commitment and employment.

### **We check and update your personal data**

We check that the personal data we process about you is not incorrect or misleading.

We also ensure that your personal data is updated regularly.

As our service depends on your data being accurate and up-to-date, we ask that you inform us of any relevant changes to your data. You can use the contact details above to notify us of your changes.

### **We delete your personal data when it is no longer necessary.**

We delete your personal data when it is no longer necessary for the purpose for which we collected, processed and stored your data.

For financial contributors and volunteers who have had their costs covered, as well as employees, we also store data for five years plus the current year after the relationship ends, cf. the Danish Accounting Act.

### **We obtain your consent before processing your personal data.**

We will obtain your consent before processing your personal data for the purposes described above, unless we have a lawful basis for collecting it. We will inform you of such basis and of our legitimate interest in processing your personal data.

Your consent is voluntary and you can withdraw it at any time by contacting us. Please use the contact details above if you would like further information.

If you are under 13, we always obtain consent from a guardian.

in addition to your consent before we process your personal data as described above.

### **We do not disclose your personal data without your consent.**

If we disclose your personal data to partners and stakeholders, we will obtain your consent and inform you about what your data will be used for. You can object to this type of disclosure at any time.

We do not obtain your consent if we are legally obliged to disclose your personal data, e.g. as part of reporting to an authority.

## **Security**

### **We protect your personal data and have internal rules on information security.**

We have adopted internal rules on information security, which contain instructions and measures that protect your personal data from being destroyed, lost or altered, from unauthorized disclosure, and from unauthorized access or knowledge.

## **Use of cookies**

Cookies, purpose and relevance

Cookies are small text files that can be used by websites to make a user's experience more efficient.

The law states that we can store cookies on your device if they are strictly necessary to ensure the provision of the service you have explicitly requested to use. For all other types of cookies, we must obtain your consent.

FrikirkeNet uses cookies to personalize content and to show you features for social media and podcast and video services. Our partners within these services may also collect information about your use of the website for targeted advertising. Our partners may combine this data with other information you have provided to them or that they have collected from your use of their services. Accepting cookies is your consent to FrikirkeNet's and third parties' use of cookies on the relevant domain.

FrikirkeNet's partners are separate data controllers for the collected data.  
You can always revoke your consent to cookies.

#### **How long do we store cookies?**

The cookies stored on your device will be stored for a varying number of months after your visit. Each time you revisit the website, the period is extended. The cookies in question are automatically deleted after their expiration. You can read below about how to delete cookies.

#### **How do you avoid cookies?**

If you do not wish to receive cookies, you can block all cookies, delete existing cookies from your hard drive, or receive a warning before a cookie is saved.

You can always use the help function in your browser to get more information about cookie settings. You typically do this by pressing "F1" on your PC. Search for "cookies".

## **Your rights**

#### **You have the right to access your personal data.**

You have the right at any time to be informed about what data we process about you, where it comes from, and what we use it for. You can also be informed about how long we store your personal data, and who receives data about you, to the extent that we transfer data in Denmark and abroad.

If you request it, we can provide you with the data we process about you in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format (data portability). However, access may be limited due to concerns about the privacy of other persons, trade secrets and intellectual property rights.

You can exercise your rights by contacting us. Our contact information can be found above.

#### **You have the right to have inaccurate personal data corrected or deleted.**

If you believe that the personal data we process about you is inaccurate, you have the right to have it corrected. You must contact us and inform us of the inaccuracies and how they can be corrected.

In some cases, we will have an obligation to delete your personal data. This applies, for example, if you withdraw your consent. If you believe that your data is no longer necessary in relation to the purpose for which we collected it, you can ask for it to be deleted. You can also contact us if you believe that your personal data is being processed in violation of the law or other legal obligations.

When you contact us with a request to correct or delete your personal data, we will check whether the conditions are met and, if so, implement changes or deletion as quickly as possible.

**You have the right to object to our processing of your personal data.**

You have the right to object to our processing of your personal data. You can use the contact details above to submit an objection. If your objection is justified, we will ensure that we cease processing your personal data.

Finally, you can complain about our processing of your personal data at any time to the Danish Data Protection Authority, Borgergade 28, 5th floor, 1330 Copenhagen K.
