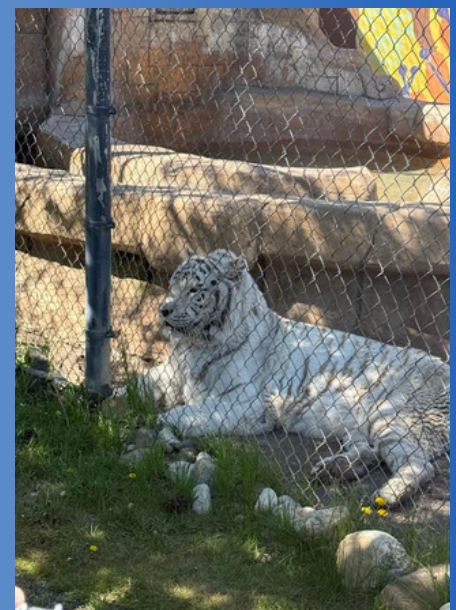
At NICS, our teachers are more than educators—they are mentors and role models who reflect the love of Christ in all they do. We are truly blessed by their dedication and impact.

Our school has adopted a two-mile section of U.S. 95 near our school to help keep our community clean through litter pickup.

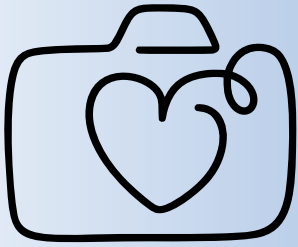

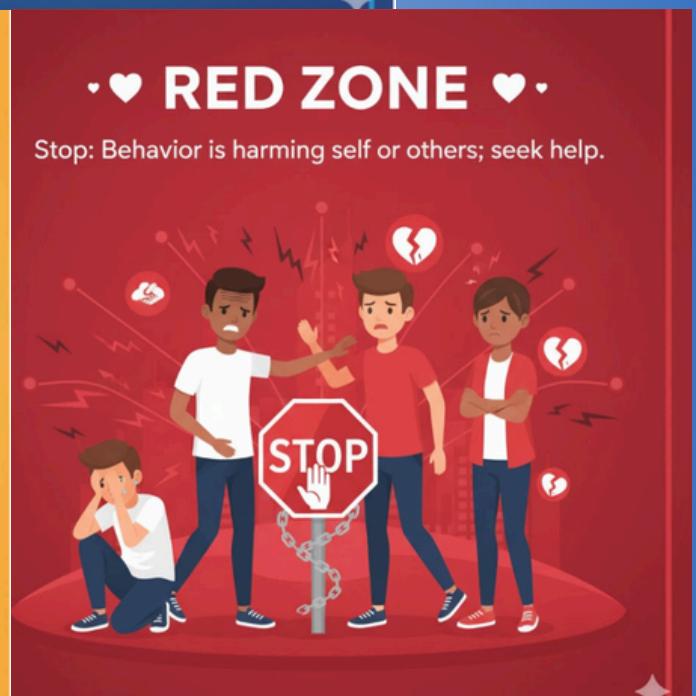
