Tickets for the 'Shenandoah Valley Limited' Are on Sale Now

STAUNTON, VA – August 13, 2025 – Rail enthusiasts, history buffs, and fall foliage lovers have a thrilling opportunity to ride behind a legend this fall. Tickets for the highly anticipated *Shenandoah Valley Limited* featuring the iconic Norfolk & Western Class J #611 steam locomotive go on sale today.

This is a chance to not just observe history, but to actually take part in an extraordinary railroading experience. This 3.5-hour train ride, which begins and ends in Goshen, spans approximately 60 miles.

"This collaboration allows us to offer a truly unique and memorable experience, combining the majesty of the N&W 611 with the stunning beauty of the Shenandoah Valley in autumn. It's a cool chance to step back in time and witness the power and grace of a living legend."

Dates: Weekends only from September 26 – October 26, 2025. The Shenandoah Valley

Limited will have two departures on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The first at

9:00 am and the second at 2:30 pm.

Location: Excursions will depart from the custom-built Victoria Station in Goshen, Virginia.

Free parking is available onsite.

Tickets: Tickets go on sale on August 13, 2025 and are exclusively available through the

Virginia Scenic Railway website. A combination of coach, table, lounge & dome

seating classes are offered.

The N&W 611 was built in 1950 by the Roanoke shop for Norfolk & Western Railway. Renowned for its streamlined design, incredible power, and speed, the 611 is the sole surviving Class J locomotive and holds designations as the Commonwealth's Official Steam Engine, a National Historic Mechanical Engineering Landmark, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

"Bringing the 611 back to the mainline for these excursions is a monumental undertaking from a committed team of partners," said **Mendy Flynn, Executive Director of the Virginia Museum of Transportation.** "The 611 is more than just a locomotive; it's a piece of American ingenuity and a symbol of our rich railroading heritage."

"For a short time, the 611 will be a living, operating piece of history. Opportunities to ride a steam locomotive of this caliber on the mainline are exceedingly rare, making this a must-do for any rail enthusiast," said **Dean Pyers**, **Executive Director of the Steam Railroading Institute**.
