With a consistent level of membership maintained across the year, the Club continues to see a diverse and inclusive professional sector spread across our membership, with women of all industries engaging with us.

IN-PERSON EVENT REGISTRATIONS ACROSS 7 EVENTS

Spence Club offered three major and three minor events in FY24-25 as well as our AGM. We introduced a keynote to commence our year and brought back our 'career conversations' model. We also charged a small fee for our minor events to cover costs in 2025. We are proud that our event registrations increased by 35% year on year in FY24-25 (200 in FY23-24).

DONATED TO OUR CHARITY PARTNER

For the 2024-2025 financial year, Spence Club has donated \$1,350 to our charity partner of the year, Catherine House, representing a 270% increase on what we donated in the previous financial year.

This means that we've been able to provide support towards almost nine nights of accommodation at the Catherine House crisis centre (as the cost per night is \$152 per client**).

We are proud of our contributions to Catherine House across FY24-25 and look forward to continuing our support of charity partners in FY25-26.

Together with our members, and a spread of delicious nibbles and drinks, we reflected on the activities, efforts and achievements of the Club across the 2023-24 financial year. There was much to talk about, and much to celebrate – especially because Spence Club turned 10 in 2024!

We warmly welcomed new Board Members who had been voted in and announced new/continuing leadership roles. We also sincerely thanked the Board Members who had reached the end of their terms and/or were stepping away from the board.

Sara was a key player in South Australia's most successful startup - Sweat, where she experienced a 240% headcount growth as the head of People & Culture in a very short space of time!

Our discussion covered themes of founding stories, working in tech, running businesses, and how to achieve 'work-life balance'. After our discussion we had a Q&A and of course – networking and conversation!





2025 Keynote: Seen & Heard with Emily Beaton

Our first event of 2025 was simply FABULOUS! Spence Club kicked off 2025 in style on February 27th with our first event of the year at the stunning new NAB building at 60 King William Street.

With tasty platters from Tony & Marks and a delicious drinks selection featuring Karrawatta Wines and Bremerton Wines, the scene was set for an unforgettable evening.

We were also thrilled to welcome rising South Australian media star and sporting great Emily Beaton, who delivered her inspiring keynote, Seen & Heard: Elevating your Visibility and Impact.

Emily shared her personal journey and challenges encountered throughout her career, connecting with us all while offering practical strategies on how to confidently pursue what you want and believe in. She shone a light on the barriers we often face when asking for what we need, or stepping forward to be seen, and empowered us with the tools to overcome them.

Some key takeaways included:

- Have your goals visible write them on a post-it and put them where you'll see them every day!
- Be bold in pursuit of your goals and ask others for help - use your network! You will be surprised and delighted at who says yes (and it's no biggie if they say no).
- Visualisation is important, powerful and helpful in taking steps towards your goals.

Through her insights and engaging Q&A session, Emily left us feeling uplifted, motivated, and ready to take action. We're so grateful for her wisdom and presence!

Career Conversations: Courage & Conviction

*May 2025 -*Mezzanine 55, Kent Town, SA

This event featured three trailblazing South Australian women who are leaders in their respective fields, who shared their career journeys of resilience, growth, bold moves and leadership.

Courage and Conviction: Navigating Tough Decisions and Trusting Your Judgement, held at the beautiful Mezzanine 55 in Kent Town on Wednesday 21 May 2025, was everything we hoped for, and more.

Our incredible speaker line up of women from very different sectors shared stories that were real, powerful, and deeply personal. What united them? They've all forged courageous careers in male-dominated industries, trusted their instincts, and made values-led decisions on their terms - each in their own unique way.

Bodelle Francis (CEO, Oakbank Racing Club) brought inspiring energy and examples of grit. She reminded us that you don't need all the answers - just the courage to show up. She spoke about needing both ambition and community, and that one without the other is isolating or hollow. Her call to action? Keep showing up. Keep saying yes. Keep moving forward. So say yes to a seat at the table ladies, and lift others up when you get there.

Melanie Rudolff (EVP People & Culture, Beach Energy) spoke vulnerably about imposter syndrome, choosing family over prestige, and the power of aligning work with values, as well as the importance of timing and self-trust. Her key takeaway: "progress over perfection", and (also) "say yes" when it feels right for you - not just because others expect it, but don't not say yes because you're scared. She reminded us that growth happens in the discomfort, and that we rise by lifting others. Her advice? Opportunities don't always come when you're looking, but mentor others and your own growth will follow.

Michelle Holland (Founder, SynergylQ) challenged dour ideas of leadership. She reminded us we don't need a title to make an impact, and that sometimes the path changes - and that's okay. She implored us to have the difficult conversations, reflect with vulnerability, and stay true to ourselves, reminding us that the world and our workplaces are better when we show up fully and authentically. Her honesty about evolving dreams and staying true to her strengths was a powerful reminder that leading is about purpose and alignment, not ego or position.

We also could not have be more inspired by the generosity of our Spence Club community. From overflowing <u>Dress for Success Adelaide</u> donations to new members stepping into the room (and to the mic!) for the first time. There was connection, vulnerability, and overwhelming support.



Informal events in 2024-25

June & December 2024, April 2025, Adelaide CBD

This financial year, Spence Club continued to organise casual members-only networking nights, offering more opportunities for our members to network in an informal way. We received feedback that these events were a great introduction to the Club for new members and it's something we will continue to offer in FY25-26.

Our two 2024 events were free and held at Roxie's in the Adelaide CBD, with nibbles provided at the expense of the Club. Our end of year, pre-festive season event was a hit with 36 people attending and many participating in our "Book Swap" for the first time.

In 2025 the Board introduced a small fee per head to cover costs at these events. We also decided to rotate the venue and change up the scenery! Our April event at Prohibition Gin was a great success with almost 30 people attending.







