Side 1 START >>>

(weakly) I heard you're taking care of two elderly women...

118 JEANNE

119 MADELEINE

I'm only twenty seven, but I'm ill and... I've no one to help me.

SHE COUGHS AGAIN, VIRGINIE COMES OVER

120 VIRGINIE

Come over by the fire and get warm.

VIRGINIE AND JEANNE SUPPORT HER TO THE FIREPLACE, WHERE SHE WARMS HER HANDS

121 FANCHON

Let me take off that wet coat.

SHE DOES, THEN BRINGS OVER A CHAIR

122 FANCHON (CONT'D)

Here, sit down.

MADELEINE SITS

123 JEANNE

What's your name?

124 MADELEINE

Madeleine. Madeleine Bourges. You see, there's a tumor growing in my breast and I know I'm dying. But I have no one to turn to in my final days. If you help me, I'll leave you all the money I have, such as it is.

126 MADELEINE
