085 BRIGID (CONT'D)

And look at that mighty oak tree, with it's branches stretching to the heavens! Come on, let's take a look.

086 BIRÓG (O.C.)

Side 1 START >>>

Bright and Fiery One, Bringer of Spring, Mistress of Milk and Honey, Keeper of the Hearth and Home.

087 MAEBH (O.C.)

We call to you, Goddess of Fire, with hands that tend this sacred fire, to protect our herds and bless our harvest.

BRIGID AND THE HORSES COME TO A STOP. THE FIRE SPITS.

088 BRIGID

(intriqued)

You are invoking the Goddess of Fire?

089 BIRÓG

We're both druids, dear. Some call us priestesses. And yes, we're tasked with keeping this ritual fire burning, as it has done for many years. That's why we call on Brigid, the Goddess of Fire.

090 BRIGID

My name is Brigid. I'm not a goddess, but I dearly wish to help you keep this sacred fire burning. Did you know, in Christianity, fire is very significant.

091 BIRÓG

(pah!)

Christianity! What's it got to do with fire?

092 MAEBH

Fire is renewal. And light.

093 BRIGID

Yes, it is in Christianity too. It indicates the presence of the Holy Spirit.

094 MAEBH 'The Holy Spirit'?

095 BRIGID

He comes to meet us and kindles faith in us. He is God's own love.

096 BIRÓG

Interesting.

097 BRIGID

(taking in surrounds) What is this place?

098 MAEBH

We're on the great Curragh plain. And where we're standing is known as 'the oak'.

099 BIRÓG

Because of the tree, you know.

100 BRIGID

(to herself)

Kildare.

101 BIRÓG

What's that, now?

102 BRIGID

(Translating the Irish)

Kildare. Cill Dara. Church of Oak.

(inspired)

I have a great wish to build a loving community here. A church and a monastery. Called Kildare. Where nuns and monks will take turns in keeping the sacred fire always burning. You would not need to camp here alone anymore.

103 MAEBH

Surely such a thing is impossible? You're but a young woman!

104 BRIGID

Will you both pray to the Triune God with me?

(MORE)

BRIGID (CONT'D)

For a way to soften the King's heart, so that we can build 'Kildare'?

105 MAEBH

This God of yours, He can do such a thing?

106 BRIGID

(passionately)

Yes! He does the most wondrous things!

107 BIRÓG

(skeptical)

Why would a god give us something <<< END without us offering something to him?

108 BRIGID

If you bow your heads, I will lead us in a prayer, and you will soon see His glory.

THE FIRE SPITS. THE WOMEN BOW THEIR HEADS.

109 BRIGID (CONT'D)

Okay. Here we qo.

(begins prayer)

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. O most Holy Trinity, we feel your burning presence here with us and ask you to...
