They also work. Hard. I've seen them. The amount of trees down! The land they've cleared! The number of buildings they've put up! The infirmary they built! They build like beavers. Wynfrith talks, yes. But he also gets things done.

089 **ALDRIC**

Theobald tells me the stories Wynfrith tell him. Jesus, their God, claims to be Lord of all. The only God! I tell you, it's dangerous he's here. Hrothgar says-

090 **BERTRIC**

You should listen less to Hrothgar.

091 **ALDRIC**

Hrothgar says it's all a ruse to convince us to betray Donar. And Wynfrith's God! He's a mockery! A god who dies on a tree! Pfaw! What sort of weak God is that?

092 **BERTRIC**

Aldric, what is all this to you? These men have done good work here. They help on the farms. They tend to our sick. Not much of a threat. And if their God is weak, what threat could He be?

093 **ALDRIC**

I'll tell you what threat He could be. It's barely rained since those monks built that monastery. The stream is drying. Hrothgar's lost half his flock. Donar is not happy.

ALDRIC (CONT'D)

He will need to be appeased, or we'll lose all our crops. Something will have to be done.

094 **BERTRIC**

What do you mean?

095 ALDRIC

Nothing.

096 **BERTRIC**

What do you mean, Aldric?

097 ALDRIC

It's just... Some in the village. They're talking. They say something will have to be done about these monks. About Wynfrith.

098 **BERTRIC**

You leave them be. Have nothing to do with Hrothgar! He stirs up trouble that doesn't need stirring.
