The new Memorial to Armed Forces LGBT+ veterans

A t the end of October, HM the King attended the dedication of the new memorial to Armed Forces LGBT+ veterans at the National Memorial Arboretum, Staffordshire. At the event the

King laid flowers alongside the Chief of the Defence Staff. The day was organised by the Royal British Legion, Office of Veterans Affairs, and the charity "Fighting with Pride." It was attended by many veterans discharged under the ban on LGBT+ service, including Fusiliers, which was only lifted in 2000.

Lt Col Matthew Clarke FUSILIERS commanded the

personnel. Their participation highlights the significant cultural change which the Armed Forces have undergone in the past 25 years, making it a fantastic, diverse and inclusive employer today.

The Regiment have recently recognised and welcomed back LGBT+ veterans, thanking them for their valuable contribution

to the nation. Lt Col Clarke said:

"As a gay officer myself it's been a hugely significant day and amazing to meet infantry veterans unjustly discharged in the 1970s and 80s, and Fusiliers who proudly served more recently in Iraq and Afghanistan."

Memorial Services commemorated the 50th Anniversary of 3 FUSILIERS South Armagh Tour

On 21-22 November, the Regiment of Fusiliers hosted a programme of special events to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the South Armagh Tour of Northern Ireland and to remember fellow soldiers who were killed in action.

Events included a special service of Remembrance at the Fusilier Museum (Bury) on Friday 21 November for invited guests, followed on the Saturday by simultaneous wreath laying services at the gravesides of six Fusiliers at 1100. These took place in Stretford, Oldham, Isle of Man, Whitley Bay, Bromley, and Colchester with a seventh ceremony also taking place in Newbiggin- by- the- Sea.

The names of the six Fusiliers who were killed in conflict or through acts of terrorism in South Armagh are:

- Cpl David Llewellyn Newcastle Died 28 Sep 75
- Cpl Edward Gleeson Bromley Died 9 Oct 75
- Sergeant Simon Francis Colchester Died 21
 Nov 75
- Fusilier Peter McDonald Stretford, Greater Manchester – Died 22 Nov 75
- Fusilier Michael Sampson Isle of Man Died 22
 Nov 75
- Fusilier James Duncan Oldham Died 22 Nov 75

The South Armagh tour was part of Op BANNER, the British Armed Forces' operation in Northern Ireland from 1969 to 2007. It was the longest continuous



deployment in British military history with the Regiment deploying 35 times.

South Armagh was once described as 'The most dangerous posting for any British Soldier in Northern Ireland.' The six Fusiliers were killed on operations during that tour by explosive devices and ambushes.

Lt Col Mike McDonald, Regimental Secretary (North), and the brother of Fusilier Peter McDonald said

"As a Regiment we wanted to mark the 50th anniversary of the South Armagh tour as well as paying tribute to those Fusiliers who lost their lives whilst serving. It is extremely personal to me as I lost my brother in South Armagh on the 22nd of November. Having services and simultaneous wreath layings will be a poignant time where we can remember them all together. Finally, a huge thank you to everyone who has supported our quest and ensured the memorial events take place across the country. We will remember them."

The Regimental Padre said grace before the dinner and a fantastic evening was had by all


